






Digital Broadcasting Technology

- Hong Kong, a pioneer in adopting digital broadcasting technology
 - Digitalised satellite and pay TV services, with over 270 pay TV channels available
 - Officially launched digital terrestrial television service in end-2007. The number of free-to-air channels reaches 11 and is increasing.
 - World leader in IPTV, with over 1 million subscribers
- HKSAR Government supports introduction of new digital technology
 - Increasing broadcasting channels and widening programming choice









Mobile Television

- Exemplar of latest technology development and multimedia convergence
- Gaining momentum in the world
 - South Korea, UK, Italy, Japan, etc. have launched commercial mobile TV
 - Many others, including HK, are conducting technical trials
- Technology advances
 - Point-to-point streaming-type mobile TV on 2.5G/3G platform
 - Point-to-multi-point broadcast-type mobile TV (DVB-H, T-DMB, MedioFLO) requiring additional spectrum









First Round Consultation

- January to May 2007
 - CEDB received 23 submissions, the majority of which welcome early introduction of mobile TV into HK.
 - OFTA received 14 industry submissions expressing interest in bidding for spectrum.
 - Favourable market response to mobile TV services in HK







Implementation Framework for Second Consultation

- Joint consultation of CEDB and OFTA
 - CEDB seeks views on policy matters
 - TA carries out consultation on spectrum allocation under the Telecommunications Ordinance
- Views are sought on
 - Spectrum availability
 - Spectrum allocation
 - Spectrum assignment
 - Licensing arrangements
 - Sharing of hilltop resources and geographical coverage







Spectrum Availability

Spectrum Allocation

- At least 50% of transmission capacity to carry mobile TV content, while the remaining capacity can be used to provide such new services as digital audio broadcasting (digital radio).
- To facilitate development of mobile TV and digital radio







Spectrum Assignment

- Auction
 - Simple pre-qualification process
 - No ownership or cross-holding restrictions
 - Rollout obligations as appropriate
 - Broadcast-type mobile TV using UHF and Band III spectrum should be required to provide territory-wide coverage.
- Levy of spectrum utilization fee







Licensing Arrangement

(for all types of mobile TV)

- Mobile TV Network (Telecommunications)
 - Carrier licence required under the Telecommunications Ordinance
- Mobile TV Content (Broadcasting)
 - Light-handed approach
 - Option 1: subject to general laws and self-regulatory codes of practice promulgated by the industry; and
 - Option 2: to amend the Broadcasting Ordinance for the Broadcasting Authority to issue licence and promulgate codes of practice to regulate mobile TV
 - Regulatory symmetry with respect to broadcast-type and streaming-type mobile TV to maintain a level playing field
- Digital audio broadcasting services, either on its own or as value added services ancillary to mobile TV, are subject to the existing sound broadcasting licensing regime.







Geographical Coverage

- Universal coverage similar to conventional free-to-air broadcasting services
- Sharing of hilltop resources (including sites and facilities) subject to mutual agreements through commercial negotiation, but the TA has the power to intervene
