Thank you for your letter dated 11 July 2008 which conveyed Members' wish to know the reasons for granting the power to the Director of Legal Aid ("DLA") to waive the upper limit of the means test in cases of a breach of human rights obligations.

In Hong Kong, human rights are fully protected by law. The legislative safeguards are enshrined in the Basic Law, the Hong Kong Bill of Rights Ordinance ("HKBORO"), and other relevant ordinances. They are buttressed by the rule of law and an independent judiciary.

Under Section 5AA of the Legal Aid Ordinance, DLA is granted the power to waive the upper limit of the means test in meritorious applications where a breach of the HKBORO or an inconsistency with the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights as applied to Hong Kong is an issue. Such power is granted as a matter of human rights consideration.
