Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress report as at the end of August 2008

Purpose

This paper updates Members on the latest progress of implementing the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) System.

Enrolment

3. Both the enrolment rates of employers and employees increased by 0.2%. The enrolment rate of SEPs decreased by 0.1%. As at the end of August 2008, 15 900 employers, 315 600 employees and 19 700 SEPs were registered under the Industry Schemes¹.

Complaint Handling

Complaints received by the MPFA

4. Of the total 675 complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA) in August 2008, 94% concerned scheme members and 437 employers were involved. The breakdown is as follows:

Complaints received by the Labour Department ("LD")

5. In August 2008, the LD received 18 MPF-related complaints, all of which were related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages and non-enrolment of employees.

6. Of the 142 complaints received from 1 January 2008 to the end of August 2008:

- 65 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
- 42 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal/Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board for adjudication;
- 1 case where the employer was insolvent was referred to the Legal Aid Department, the Official Receiver's Office and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund;
- 33 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation result; and
- 1 case was awaiting the employee's decision on whether to lodge claim with the LD for conciliation.

² GIC stands for the Government's injection of \$6,000 into the accounts of eligible members of MPF and MPF exempted ORSO registered schemes.

Enforcement

7. The MPFA continued to enforce the MPF Schemes Ordinance by investigation of complaints, inspections of employment premises, making claims at law courts on behalf of employees to recover the outstanding default contributions, and prosecuting offending employers.

8. The enforcement actions taken by the MPFA in August 2008 are summarized below:

Education and Publicity

9. The publicity for the MPF Schemes (Amendment) Ordinance 2008 to promulgate the commencement date and details of the amendments continued in August 2008. The TV and radio APIs were broadcast at all 42 local free and paid TV channels and 12 channels of three local radio stations.

10. Selected winning entries of the primary school story writing competition continued to be on display at the Community Art Gallery of MTR station to further disseminate messages to encourage youngsters to develop the good habit of saving for the future.

11. Community outreach activities also continued in the month of August. A total of 13 MPF seminars were arranged for civil servants, employees, self-employed persons, professionals, mainland visitors and teachers.

12. On the media front, 19 press releases were issued in relation to MPFA's enforcement actions and MPFA's reminders to self-employed persons to report their relevant income by 29 August 2008, as well as to employees urging them to report non-enrolment and default contribution by 31 October 2008 so that the MPFA can determine their relevant income, and thereby their eligibility. In addition, 15 contribution articles on various MPF topics were published through different channels in the media, focusing mainly on MPF investment and the GIC Project.
