Briefing by the Administration on the response to the Committee Stage amendments (CSAs) proposed by Mr James TO (LC Paper No. CB(1)1665/08-09(02)). Having considered the CSAs to provide the maximum percentage (i.e.25%) of reduction (the reduction ceiling) of the accrued benefits attributable to Government's voluntary contributions (GVC benefits), the Administration remained of the view that specifying the reduction ceiling for GVC benefits in a government circular was the best course, as it was consistent with the approach to provide the basis of the Civil Service Provident Fund (CSPF) Scheme,	
		(c)	including all its terms and conditions, in contract. The Administration did not support the CSAs proposed by Mr James TO. Noting the Administration's response, Mr James TO's comment that it would be for the Bills Committee to consider whether the proposed CSAs would be moved in its name.	
		(d)	In response to the Chairman's enquiry, ALA7's advice that she agreed in general to the observations of the Administration made on the drafting of the proposed CSAs.	
		(e)	Given the number of members present and the Administration's response to the proposed CSAs, Mr TAM Yiu-chung's view that it might not be desirable for the Bills Committee to make a decision on moving the proposed CSAs in its name at the meeting.	
		(f)	Mr James TO's view that if the Bills Committee would not move the proposed CSAs in its name, he planned to move these in his own name.

	(b) Noting the Administration's explanation on the effect of dismissal on a civil servant's claims to civil service benefits, ALA7's comment that the use of the word "vested" in the proposed section 31(2)(b) of the Police Force Ordinance (PFO) (Cap. 232) in clause 6 of the Bill was acceptable from the drafting point of view.		
		(c) The Chairman's concern whether the use of the word "vested" in clause 6 of the Bill would be in breach of the provisions in the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (MPFSO) (Cap. 485), as the accrued benefits attributable to the mandatory and voluntary contributions were held in the name of the employees, i.e. the civil servant concerned. His concern whether the forfeiture of GVC benefits upon summary dismissal of the police officer would involve the repayment of the benefits from the officer concerned to the Government instead.	
		(d) The Administration's advice that the concept of vesting of GVC benefits before they were paid to the individual concerned was in line with those in the MPFSO and the terms and conditions of the CSPF Scheme.
