Action

I. Election of Chairman

Mr IP Kwok-him was elected Chairman of the Bills Committee.

II. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper Nos. CB(2)1622/08-09(02) - (05), CB(3)548/08-09, LS66/08-09 and CMAB C1/30/25]

- 2. The Bills Committee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. The Administration was requested to provide a paper to explain the administrative and security arrangements for prisoners and remanded unconvicted persons to be registered as an elector and to vote on the polling day (e.g. guidelines for law enforcement agencies to detain persons before or on the polling day, arrangements to protect secrecy of votes, arrangements for remanded unconvicted persons to vote in functional constituency elections and subsector elections, arrangements for prisoners detained in medical wards to vote, access to election-related materials by prisoners, etc.).

4. <u>Mr James TO</u> requested the Administration to keep in view of the implications brought about by the Bill on the restoration of prisoners' rights to participate in socio-economic activities such as to be a member of an owners' corporation, a director of a limited company, etc. which were removed at present.

Public consultation

- 5. The Bills Committee agreed to invite public views on the Bill and that the following actions should be taken -
 - (a) a general invitation for submissions would be posted on the website of the Legislative Council;
 - (b) the two legal professional bodies would be invited to give views on the legal aspect of the Bill; and
 - (c) a letter would be sent to the Correctional Services Department requesting them to notify the imprisoned persons of the opportunity to give views on the Bill to the Bills Committee.

- 6. The Bills Committee also agreed to schedule three meetings with the following arrangements -
 - (a) meeting on 1 June 2009 from 2:30 pm to 4:30 pm to discuss the Administration's response to the issues raised by members at this meeting and to conduct clause-by-clause examination of the Bill;
 - (b) meeting on 8 June 2009 from 10:45 am to 12:45 pm to receive views from individuals and organizations; and
 - (c) meeting on 11 June 2009 from 8:30 am to 10:30 am to continue deliberations of the Bill.
