 - (d) to provide information on whether a different statutory minimum wage was provided for young people in other jurisdictions; and
 - (e) to explain whether the exemption under clause 6(3) of the Bill for live-in domestic workers would constitute indirect discrimination under the Sex Discrimination Ordinance and the Race Discrimination Ordinance.
