2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> completed the study of Parts 1 to 5 and Parts 7 to 8 of the mark-up English version of the United Nations Sanctions (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) (Amendment) Regulation 2010 (the Amendment Regulation).

# Admin 3. The Administration undertook to provide:

- (a) a written explanation on the rationale and basis for introducing the new measure of empowering a magistrate or judge to make order for forfeiture and disposal of seized items on application by an authorized officer, and provided for procedures for the owner (or authorized agent of the owner) of the seized items to object to the proposed forfeiture under the new sections 24A and 24B (as added by section 26 of the Amendment Regulation);
- (b) details of the sanctions against the DPRK pursuant to the instructions from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) of the People's Republic of China in June, July and August 2009 which requested the HKSAR

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Government to implement Resolution 1874 and decisions made by the Committee established under paragraph 12 of Resolution 1718 of the Security Council of the United Nations (UNSC); and

(c) the list of persons or entities designated by the Committee or the UNSC under Resolution 1718 as specified by the Chief Executive (CE) by notice in the Gazette in accordance with section 31 of the United Nations Sanctions (Democratic People's Republic of Korea) Regulation (Cap. 537AE) as amended by the Amendment Regulation.

		Amendment Regulation purported to have serious penal effect and confer vast enforcement power. The provisions of such a nature should be subject to vetting by the legislature. Concern was raised as to whether such provisions were ultra vires of the primary legislation.  Noting that the new section 24A had provided for the owner (or authorized agent of the owner) of the seized items to object to the proposed forfeiture, the Chairman and Ms Cyd HO expressed concern that the forfeiture provision was not provided for under the principal Ordinance.
