The Secretariat would consult members on the meeting date nearer the time.

The Administration advised that as provided under Sections 9 and 10, it would be up to the Committee of the Security Council under the United Nations Security Council to determine on a case-by-case basis that the supply, sale, transfer or carriage of the regulated prohibited items, or the provision of the technical training, financial resources or services, advice, other services or assistance would clearly not contribute to the development of Iran's technologies in support of Iran's proliferation of sensitive nuclear activities or the development of Iran's nuclear weapons delivery systems. Applicants of licences under sections 9 and 10 would also have to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive of the HKSAR Government that the activities mentioned above would clearly not contribute to the development of Iran's technologies in support of Iran's
