# I. Immigration policy relating to Mainland-Hong Kong families

(LC Paper Nos. CB(2)1070/08-09(01) and (05), CB(2)1232/08-09(01) and CB(2)1640/08-09(01) to (02))

The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. The Subcommittee deliberated on paragraph 15 of the paper entitled "Immigration policy relating to Mainland-HKSAR families" and made some amendments to the paper. Members generally considered that the daily One Way Permits (OWPs) quota of 150 places should be fully utilised, and the unused places should be allocated flexibly to applications of other categories. After discussion, members agreed on the following recommendations for the Administration's consideration
  - (a) further shortening the waiting time for the issue of OWPs to separated spouses from four years to three years or less, with priority given to
    - (i) those separated for 10 years or above, and the waiting time for the issue of OWPs should be shortened to less than one year; and
    - (ii) Mainland spouses with young children aged below 12 in Hong Kong;

#### Action

- (b) opening a channel for Mainland adult children of Hong Kong residents under the OWP Scheme without imposing the restriction of only one Mainland adult child was allowed to come to Hong Kong, with priority given to those
  - (i) who were the right of abode claimants;
  - (ii) with unsupported parents aged 60 or above in Hong Kong; and
  - (iii) with frail parents in Hong Kong;
- (c) opening a channel for Mainland parents of Hong Kong residents under the OWP Scheme, with priority given to those unsupported Mainland parents, and allowing Hong Kong children born to Mainland residents to apply for household registrations such that the former could choose to return to and live together with their parents in Mainland;
- (d) opening a channel for Mainland spouses of Hong Kong residents who had applied for OWPs but became ineligible due to the passing away of their spouses (who were Hong Kong residents) or divorce, with priority given to Mainland single mothers with children in Hong Kong;
- (e) allowing Mainland mothers visiting Hong Kong on the strength of a Two Way Permit (TWP) with "visiting relatives" exit endorsement to stay for a longer period of time, say, from three months to six months or to tie in with the school term breaks, so as to enable them to take care of their children attending school in Hong Kong; and
- (f) setting up a joint liaison working group comprising representatives from the Mainland authorities and HKSAR Government to review the immigration arrangements and deal with complaints and appeals relating to the issue of OWPs and TWPs.
- Admin 3. <u>The Administration</u> advised that it would study the Subcommittee's recommendations and their implications, and exchange views with the Mainland authorities as appropriate. It aimed to revert to the Subcommittee on the progress in three months' time.
- Admin 4. To facilitate members' future discussion, the Administration was requested to provide/obtain from the relevant Mainland authorities the following information –

#### Action

- (a) the waiting time for spouses separated for 10 years or above upon application for OWPs;
- (b) the number of applicants that could be benefited if the waiting time for the issue of OWPs to separated spouses was further shortened from four years to three years, and whether the additional eligible applicants could be met within the daily quota of 150 places;
- (c) whether the utilisation of the daily OWP quota of 150 places was calculated on a daily, monthly or yearly basis, and whether the unused quota could be carried forward to the next calculation period;
- (d) the number of Mainland residents waiting for the issue of OWPs and the number of OWPs issued on a quarterly basis; and
- (e) the number of Mainland residents visiting Hong Kong on the strength of a TWP, together with a breakdown by reasons of applications (such as taking care of their children, old/frail parents in Hong Kong), and their cumulative duration of stay in Hong Kong.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Legislative Council Secretariat would incorporate members' views and suggestions and revise the draft paper as appropriate. The revised draft paper would be circulated for members' consideration before forwarding to the Administration for consideration and follow-up.

### II. Any other business

- 6. <u>Members</u> agreed to discuss and receive views from deputations on the arrangements for the use of obstetric services by Mainland women at the next meeting to be held on 29 June 2009.
- 7. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 10:17 am.
