Members noted the Administration's intention to defer the commencement of the Independent Police Complaints Council (IPCC) Ordinance to 1 June 2009 to allow more time for Members to examine the resources allocated to the future statutory IPCC. According to the Administration, it would repeal the Independent Police Complaints Council Ordinance (Commencement) Notice by publishing a notice in the Gazette in the first instance, and would separately publish a new commencement notice in the Gazette in due course, with a view to concluding the negative vetting procedure in early May 2009.
- 3. Members noted that a verbal report of the Subcommittee would be made by the Chairman at the House Committee meeting on 20 February 2009, followed by a written report for the House Committee on 27 February 2009.
