- 2. The Subcommittee completed scrutiny of the Voting by Imprisoned Persons Ordinance (Commencement) Notice 2009 and the detailed provisions of the five Amendment Regulations on electoral procedure and the three Amendment Regulations on registration of electors.
- 3. The Administration undertook to provide its response to members' concerns over new sections 28(1)(c) and 45(6)(ga)-(gb) of the Electoral Affairs Commission (Electoral Procedure) (Legislative Council) Regulation (Cap. 541 sub. leg. D), together with the finalized amendments to be proposed, by the following week for the Subcommittee's consideration by circulation. Members agreed that if there was no request for the Subcommittee to hold a further meeting to discuss the Administration's response, the Subcommittee would report to the House Committee on 9 October 2009 supporting the relevant subsidiary legislation. Members noted that the deadline for the Administration to give notice of amendments would be 14 October 2009.
