12. Mode of supply of self-financed item (SFI) drugs to patients of public hospitals

At the meeting on 12 February 2007, the Administration was requested to report to the Panel when the HA Board had come to a view on the mode of supply of SFI drugs before implementation. The Administration was also requested to review the assessment criteria for introducing new drugs into the HA Drug Formulary and for assistance under the Samaritan Fund.

When the grant for the Samaritan Fund was discussed at the Panel meeting on 10 November 2008, members raised concern about the assessment criteria and the operation of the Drug Formulary and the Samaritan Fund. Members considered it necessary to advance the discussion on the matter at a forthcoming Panel meeting.

13. Regulation of "Health Maintenance Organisations" (HMOs)
