## Supporting an Electronic Health Record Sharing Infrastructure in Hong Kong

The former Chairman of US Federal Reserve, Alan Greenspan expressed repeatedly the necessity of adopting information technology (IT) to drive better standard of living and at the same time lower the cost of healthcare. The new US President Barack Obama echoes.

On behave of Hong Kong Linux Industry Association, I write to support the Government's initiative to develop a territory-wide electronic health record (eHR) sharing system.

To develop such system, it requires close co-operation and collaboration between the medical and IT professionals for years or decade to define and implement the complex system.

We wish to point out that the eHR system is an expensive investment for the Government but will bring along long-term benefit to the private sector and the patients. In light of the maturity of Open Source Software, we wish to mention the following points in considering to control cost, security and adaptability of the eHR system.

- 2. Adopt Open Source Software for better value for money
- 3. Apply Web 2.0 for interactive applications
- 4. Apply Cloud Computing for slim and lean software and hardware on client side.

We believe that our expertise in Open Source Software could be applicable to public and private healthcare providers in upgrading their information systems with much lower cost, high system reliability and yet bettering the quality and delivery of care to patients and minimizing medical errors.

Being able to participate in this project and in many constructive partnerships, involving both public and private sectors across both healthcare and IT, will be a major boost to the local IT industry.
