I. Election of Chairman

Mr James TO was elected Chairman of the Subcommittee.

2. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

II. Meeting with the Administration

- 3. The Subcommittee requested the Administration to -
 - (a) provide information on the number of Level III searches conducted on detainees from July to September 2008 where the detainee was suspected of being involved in offences under the Public Order Ordinance (Cap. 245) or obstructing police officers engaged in a public duty under the Summary Offences Ordinance (Cap. 228) in public order events;

- (b) randomly select 100 cases from those 1 674 Level III searches conducted from July to September 2008, and provide the records of these cases in the Communal Information System, with personal data excised, to illustrate the justifications for conducting Level III searches;
- (c) provide information on how Level III searches would be subdivided into those involving complete removal of underwear, partial removal of underwear and looking into the underwear;
- (d) provide information on the number of searches involving complete removal of clothing conducted after introduction of the use of equipment/device to assist Police officers in the conduct of searches;
- (e) provide a progress update on the status of the Administration's consideration in respect of the suggestions made by the Subcommittee on Police's Handling of Searches of Detainees;
- (f) provide information on the Police's guidelines on undercover anti-vice operations, and advise when such guidelines were introduced;
- (g) explain whether change money collected from sex workers during undercover operations would be confiscated or returned to the sex worker concerned:
- (h) advise whether off-duty Police officers were allowed to visit "one sex worker apartments" and patronise services from sex workers within or outside the district to which an officer was posted;
- (i) gather information on the practice of overseas jurisdictions as to whether their police officers undertaking undercover operations were allowed to receive masturbation or other sexual services offered by sex workers; and
- (j) consider introducing measures for monitoring the work and conduct of Police officers while engaged in undercover anti-vice operations.

III. Date of next meeting

4. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the next meeting would be scheduled pending the availability of the information to be provided by the Administration.
