<u>The Bills Committee</u> received views from the 14 deputations attending the meeting (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

(*Post-meeting note*: a summary of views expressed by deputations attending the meetings on 1 and 7 June 2010 (LC Paper No. CB(1)2711/09-10) has been prepared by the Secretariat.)

- 2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> noted the following major views expressed by deputations at the meeting
  - (a) Non-franchised bus operators requested that exemptions for public light buses (PLBs) (i.e. exempting the first two PLBs of each route at a PLB stand) should be applicable to non-franchised buses as well;
  - (b) The proposals from Electric Transport System Limited (ETS) on how to keep the ambient temperature inside an idling vehicle with the engine switched off at an optimal level; and

- (c) The Hong Kong Asthma Society, the Hong Kong Paediatric Society and some green groups' views on the serious health hazards posed by roadside emissions and on the need to implement the prohibition against idling vehicles with running engines (the idling prohibition).
- 3. In response, the Administration highlighted the public's call for improvement to air quality, and the various exemptions already incorporated in the Bill to cater to the specific operational needs of different transport trades. The Administration, however, undertook to seriously examine all views received in conjunction with the Bills Committee with a view to forging a consensus on whether any further exemptions should be granted.
- 4. <u>The Bills Committee</u> discussed the impacts of the idling prohibition on professional drivers and the need for further exemptions to be granted on very hot days.

#### Follow-up actions required of the Administration

#### Admin

- 5. The Administration was requested to provide the following information to address concerns raised by members at the meeting -
  - (a) Response to the submission from Mr Nigel LAM of ETS [LC Paper No. CB(1)2117/09-10(09)] regarding the availability of devices "that can power most vehicles' air conditioning systems whilst their engines are switched off" and assessments on the technical viability and the cost involved;
  - (b) Information on the provision of supporting facilities such as the provision of shades and covers for stands/termini for taxis, PLBs, etc; and
  - (c) Justifications for granting exemption from complying with the idling prohibition to the first two green PLBs of each route at a PLB stand but not to non-franchised buses.
