 - (a) appointment mechanism and practice in making nominations/appointments unified regulators for to telecommunications and broadcasting sectors in overseas jurisdictions, such as the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom and Australia;
 - (b) the current membership of the Broadcasting Authority (BA) and to advise whether it was in compliance with the six-year and six-board Rules (the six-six Rules) and the principle of gender mainstreaming; and
 - (c) the current consultative mechanism and committee structure under the BA and the Telecommunications Authority (TA).

<u>Invitation of views for the next meeting</u>

5. <u>Members</u> agreed to invite relevant stakeholders and the public to give views on the Bill at the next meeting scheduled for 7 October 2010 at 2:30 pm in the Chamber of the Legislative Council Building. <u>The Chairman</u> instructed the Clerk to circulate a proposed list of organizations to the Bills Committee for consideration. He invited members to notify the Clerk if they wished to invite any organizations to the meeting. A general notice would be posted on the Legislative Council website to invite submissions from the public and interested parties.

000911 - 001358	Chairman Mrs Regina IP Administration	Given the expanded remit of the Communications Authority (CA) with jurisdiction over the broadcasting and telecommunications sectors, Mrs Regina IP expressed concern about the wide powers of the proposed CA, and enquired about the overseas practice in appointing/nominating members to similar regulatory bodies, in particular, whether such appointment/nomination had to be endorsed by the legislature. She said that the appointment mechanism and the membership of the CA as well as the arrangement in respect of the disclosure of interests by members should be carefully examined to ensure transparency, impartiality and accountability to the public. The Administration responded that: (a) the proposed CA would comprise five to ten non-official members (including a non-official Chairperson) and a public officer, all of them to be appointed by the Chief Executive (CE), and the Director-General of Communications (DG Com) as an ex-officio member; (b) there were express provisions in the Bill governing the disclosure of interests (clause 13), and disclosure of confidential information (clause 21) by members of the CA to ensure that the CA would	The Administration to follow up as stated in paragraph 4(a) of the minutes.

		(c) the appointment mechanism (i.e. CE to make appointments) was consistent with those of most statutory bodies in Hong Kong;	
		(d) reference had been made to the appointment mechanism of similar regulatory bodies in overseas jurisdictions, such as the United States, Canada, United Kingdom and Australia; and	
		(e) as a matter of administrative law, the CE was required to exercise his power of appointment in a reasonable manner and to appoint only suitable candidates.	
001359 -	Chairman	Mr LEE Wing-tat expressed his views as follows:	
002700	Mr LEE Wing-tat Administration	(a) given the wide powers of the proposed CA, and to guard against the danger of the CA becoming a "super power" and an "independent kingdom", a check and balance mechanism should be in place to oversee its operation and ensure transparency;	
		(b) similar to the provisions in the Urban Renewal Authority Ordinance (Cap. 563), express provisions should be included in the Bill requiring the CA to submit an annual report to the Legislative Council (LegCo), attend LegCo meetings, answer Members' questions, and publish the results of its investigations into complaints, etc;	
		(c) the appointment mechanism should be institutionalized to prevent appointing people of the same view to the CA; and	
		(d) appointments to the CA should not be made by the CE. Instead, consideration should be given for a certain number of non-official members of the CA to be nominated/elected by industry bodies and community groups, such as human rights organizations/ethnic minorities, the Hong Kong Journalist Association, etc.	
		Citing the practice in the United States and Taiwan as examples, Mr LEE Wing-tat and Ms Emily LAU urged the Administration to consider the role of the LegCo in endorsing the appointment of CA members.	
		The Administration responded that:

		(a) to address the concern of the Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting on the CA's small membership, the proposed number of non-official members of the CA had been increased from five to "no fewer than five and no more than ten";	
		(b) there are provisions in the Bill covering the accountability and governance of the CA. For example, clause 6 of the Bill required the CA to submit an annual report to the CE and to table it in the LegCo;	
		(c) though not as a requirement in the legislation, the chairperson of the CA and the DG Com would stand ready to attend LegCo meetings to report on the work of CA, as the current BA Chairman and the heads of the Office of the Telecommunications Authority (OFTA) and the Television and Entertainment Licensing Authority (TELA) were;	
		(d) the executive arm of the CA (i.e. the Office of the Communications Authority), as a government department, would be accountable to LegCo in the same way as any other government departments;	
		(e) the CA would be an industry regulator. Allowing industry bodies to nominate or elect CA Members would give rise to potential conflict of interests; and	
		(f) the prevailing appointments by the CE to statutory bodies had been well-established and functioning smoothly. The Administration would adopt the same mechanism for appointing CA members.

		The Administration responded that:	
		(a) following the practices of the BA, the CA would continue to conduct public hearings on various topics (such as mid-term review of free TV licences) for the public to express their views on the CA's work;	
		(b) the future CA should have the flexibility to decide whether and when meetings would be open to the public;	
		(c) the six-six Rules and the principle of gender mainstreaming were established Government policies and need not be specifically provided in the Bill. The Administration would adhere to these policies while appointing CA members, similar to that for appointing BA Members;	The Administration to follow up as stated in paragraph 4(b) of the minutes.
		(d) upholding the freedom of speech was a core value of Hong Kong which statutory bodies in Hong Kong including the CA would adhere to; and	
		(e) the CA should be allowed the flexibility to determine what its exact public missions should be, having regard to its own state of development, the fast changing telecommunications and broadcasting landscape, and the overriding commitment for the CA to further the development of the communications market in Hong Kong.	
003813 – 004033	Chairman Mr WONG Ting-kwong Administration	Mr WONG Ting-kwong enquired about the current consultative mechanism and committee structure under the BA and the TA, and whether changes would be made to the consultative committees under the future CA.	The Administration to follow up as stated in paragraph 4(c) of the minutes.
		The Administration responded that pending the rationalization of the Broadcasting Ordinance (Cap. 562) and the Telecommunications Ordinance (Cap. 106) after the establishment of the CA, the Administration had no plan to change the structure of consultative committees currently under the BA and the TA.

004034 – 004429	Chairman Mrs Regina IP Administration	Given the wide powers of the proposed CA, Mrs Regina IP reiterated her concern about the membership of the Board of CA, the potential conflict of interests of members (especially those who were related to the electronic communications sector) appointed to the Board, the need for a check and balance and monitoring mechanism to ensure transparency, impartiality and safeguard public interests. The Administration responded that provisions governing the disclosure of interests by CA members were stipulated in the Bill. The official members (DG Com and a public officer) appointed to the Board would help ensure the impartiality of the CA and safeguard public interests.
