Action

I. Meeting with the Administration

[LC Paper No. CB(2)543/10-11(01)]

<u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> noted the Administration's response to issues raised by members at the last meeting held on 3 December 2010 (LC Paper No. CB(2)543/10-11(01)). In response to the Chairman's enquiry, the Administration would conduct random check to find out whether those persons who did not renew the registration under the Food Safety Ordinance still continued their food importation or food distribution business.

Clause-by-clause examination of the Bill

Clause 14 - Revocation of registration

3. <u>The Administration</u> advised that consideration was being given to introducing a Demerit Point System in relation to the revocation of registration of food importers and food distributors who repeatedly contravened the Food Safety Ordinance in the past 12 months. The trade

would be consulted if the Administration considered that the system was worth pursuing.

- 4. Mr Tommy CHEUNG noted that under clause 14(2)(b), the Director of Food and Environmental Hygiene ("DFEH") could revoke a person's registration in respect of a business (i.e. food importation business or food distribution business), if DFEH was satisfied that, in the case of a natural person, the person had died. Mr CHEUNG said that to enable immediate family member or successor of the deceased to continue operating the business previously registered under the name of the deceased, automatic transfer of registration to immediate family member or successor of the deceased should be allowed as practised in the transfer of liquor licence if the licensee had died.
- 5. <u>Mr WONG Ting-kwong</u> was of the view that instead of revoking a person's registration if that person died, it was more preferable from a management point of view if DFEH allowed that person's registration be transferred to his/her family member or business partner.
- 6. The Administration advised that clause 14(5)(b) stipulated that revocation of registration took effect on the expiry of 30 days after the day on which the decision to revoke the registration was made. This should allow adequate time for the family member or the related person to make a new application and for the application to be processed. The Administration undertook to state in the guidelines for registration that in case of death of a natural person who held a valid registration prior to his death, if anyone wished to continue operating the business registered under the name of the deceased, a new application would have to be made.
- 7. Mr Tommy CHEUNG said that it would be difficult for the Administration to trace the source of problem food if a food importation/distribution business registered under the name of the deceased was taken over by another person under a new registration, as the latter was not obliged to maintain the records of the movement of the problem food previously kept by the deceased.
- 8. <u>The Administration</u> responded that it was unlikely that the new registrant would dispose the records of the acquisition and supply of food kept by the deceased, if the new registrant wished to continue to carry on the business registered under the name of the deceased.

- 9. <u>Ms Audrey EU</u> agreed in principle that anyone wishing to continue operating the business registered under the name of the deceased should apply for a new application. <u>Ms EU</u>, however, was of the view that the Administration should make clear under what circumstances DFEH would exercise his power under clause 14(2)(b) to revoke a registration, as the family member or the successor of the deceased might wish to sell the business of the deceased and it would be much easier to do so and at a good price if the business was a going concern.
- 10. <u>Assistant Legal Adviser 8</u> sought clarification from the Administration whether a sole proprietary food importation or food distribution business registered under the name of a natural person would be revoked by DFEH if that person was bankrupt.
- 11. <u>The Administration</u> advised that the fact that a registered food importer/ food distributor was bankrupt did not necessarily mean that he/she would cease trading. As such, revocation of registration would not be applied in this case if the business was ongoing.

		(c) the Centre for Food Safety of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department would conduct random check to find out whether those persons who did not renew the registration under the Food Safety Ordinance still carried on their food importation or food distribution business.
