Claims Statistics with respect to Hong Kong Solicitors Professional Indemnity Fund up to the 2010/2011 Indemnity Year

Professional indemnity cover

- (i) Since the indemnity year 1988/89, the average claim size has ranged from HK\$0.6 million to HK\$2.7 million, well below the statutory indemnity limit of HK\$10 million per claim.
- (ii) From the 1994/95 indemnity year to 2010/11 indemnity year (both inclusive), there have been 3,525 claims on the Hong Kong Solicitors Indemnity Fund (including notifications), out of which, only 63 claimants, i.e. 1.8 %, have sought HK\$10 million or more.

(iii) Of these 63 claims:

(aa) Payout of HK\$10 million

There are 17 claims in which the Fund paid HK\$10 million (including defence cost but less the indemnified's deductible).

Of these 17 claims, 12 were brought by companies and five by individuals.

(bb) Payout between HK\$8 million and HK\$10 million

There are 15 claims in which the actual or expected payment by the Fund (including defence costs) is or will be more than HK\$8 million but less than HK\$10 million.

Of these claims, 11 were brought by companies and 4 by individuals.

(cc) Payout of less than HK\$8 million

There are 17 claims in which the claimant sought HK\$10 million or more, but which were settled for less than HK\$8 million (including defence costs).

Of these claims, 14 were brought by companies and 3 by individuals.

(dd) Payout that may reach HK\$10 million for open claims

There are 10 open claims in which it is anticipated that the claim payments (including defence costs) will reach HK\$10 million (including the deductible).

Of these claims, 7 were brought by companies alone, two by individuals and one by a company and individual jointly.

(ee) Payout that may be less than HK\$8 million for open claims

There are 4 open claims in which the claimants are seeking HK\$10 million or more but it is anticipated that the claims will settle for less than HK\$8 million (including defence costs).

Three of these claims were brought by companies and one by an individual.
