Action

I. Meeting with the Administration

[The Bill, LC Paper Nos. CB(2)2002/09-10(01), CB(2)2274/09-10(01), CB(2)2289/09-10(01), CB(2)186/10-11(01), CB(2)304/10-11(01), CB(2)578/10-11(01) and CB(2)599/10-11(01) to (02)]

<u>The Bills Committee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

Action

- 2. Given that it was unable to identify a suitable date in December 2010 for the proposed visit to Chi Yun School and two private residential care homes for persons with disabilities ("RCHDs"), members agreed that the visit should be conducted in January 2011.
- 3. Noting that the minimum net floor area per RCHD resident was proposed to be set at 6.5m², members were concerned whether the residents would be provided with adequate space for personal living and nursing care. The Administration advised that the proposed licensing scheme aimed to set out the minimum requirements and standards on the operation of RCHDs. To encourage private RCHDs to upgrade their service standards, a pilot Bought Place Scheme for private RCHDs would be introduced. Participating private RCHDs would need to meet higher staffing and spatial requirements.

Admin 4. The Administration was requested to -

- (a) provide further information on how to ensure that RCHD residents were provided with adequate personal living and nursing care space under the proposed minimum spatial requirement of 6.5 m² per resident; and
- (b) consider refining the meaning of net floor area under the 2008 CoP and spelling out clearly that the floor area per resident included personal living and nursing care space of individual residents.

- 6. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 12:45 pm.
