Follow-up actions required to be taken by the Administration

- 3. <u>The Subcommittee</u> requested the Administration to:
 - (a) consider allocating additional resources to provide free full-body vehicle washing services for more private refuse collection vehicles (RCVs);
 - (b) explore other measures to accommodate those loaded private RCVs requiring overnight parking near the South East New Territories (SENT) Landfill, e.g. providing enclosed parking lots for these RCVs at the two public car parks near the LOHAS Park to park overnight, or designating an area near or within the SENT Landfill for the purpose;
 - (c) provide detailed information on the initial findings of the e-nose monitoring at the SENT Landfill and Ocean Shores;
 - (d) consider subsidizing private waste collection operators in retrofitting their RCVs with metal tailgate cover and wastewater sump;
 - (e) provide information on the outcome of an independent survey on odour intensity conducted by tertiary students during the summer of 2007; and
 - (f) provide the paper considered by the Country and Marine Parks Board on designation of potential sites as part of the Clear Water Bay Country Park.

Motion

4. In view of that the persistent odour problem in Tseung Kwan O remained unresolved, <u>Ms Miriam LAU</u> moved the following motion:

It also highlighted that: -	
		(EPD), the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) agreed to consider including more specific provisions in the outsourced contracts requiring their contractors to provide metal tailgate cover and wastewater sump tanks in the refuse collection vehicles (RCVs) under their contracts;	
		(b) the design of the full-body vehicle washing facility at the landfill was completed. Prior to its commissioning, the SENT Landfill contractor had since early September 2010 set up an interim facility to provide free manual vehicle-body cleaning service to private RCVs visiting the SENT Landfill;	
		(c) at the recommendation of the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD), the Country and Marine Parks Board (CMPB) agreed at the meeting on 21 September 2010 to include the upper slope above the Tai Au Mun Road of about 15 hectares (ha) into the boundary of the Clear Water Bay Country Park (CWBCP); and	
		(d) according to the initial findings of the e-nose monitoring at Ocean Shores, the odour thereat seemed to be related to sewage.	
003949 – 004919	Chairman Ms Miriam LAU Administration Assistant Legal Adviser (ALA)	In response to Ms Miriam LAU's concerns, the Administration advised that while the Housing and Environmental Hygiene Committee of the Sai Kung District Council (SKDC) appreciated EPD's efforts taken to abate the odour problem at Tseung Kwan O (TKO), the stance of SKDC's objection to the proposed extension of the SENT Landfill remained unchanged.

004920 – 005745	Chairman Ms Emily LAU Administration	Ms Emily LAU was disappointed that despite the odour problem in TKO remained unresolved and the objection of SKDC and local residents, the Administration had introduced the Amendment Order and appointed 1 November 2010 as the commencement date. She indicated that Members belonging to the Democratic Party could hardly give their support to the Amendment Order. The Administration highlighted the Government's initiatives on waste reduction and recycling in the "Policy Framework for the Management of Municipal Solid Waste (2005-2014)". If the 5 ha of land from CWBCP could not be excised for landfilling purpose, RCVs using the SENT Landfill would need to go farther to dispose of refuse at the other two strategic landfills.	
005746 – 010642	Chairman Ms Cyd HO Administration	Ms Cyd HO was disappointed to note that not much progress had been made in the past two months to combat the odour problem in TKO. She expressed the following concerns:- (a) potential fire hazards associated with some unknown waste assignments/ compositions (e.g. flammable waste) carried by those loaded private RCVs staying overnight at the landfill, if any, were also present during day time; and (b) additional resources should be allocated to provide free full-body vehicle washing services for more private RCVs, having regard that these RCVs usually underwent such washing only once a year before annual check-up. The Administration responded that:- (a) it would explore other measures to accommodate those loaded private RCVs requiring overnight parking further	The Administration to provide information as requested in paragraph 3(a) and 3(b) of the minutes.

He agreed that concrete measures should be drawn up to reduce the odour at Ocean Shores as the source had already been identified by the e-nose monitoring. 		The Administration advised that while no conclusion had been drawn from the initial findings of the e-nose monitoring, the source of odour at Ocean Shores did not appear to be related to RCVs as they normally used Wan Po Road to access the SENT Landfill.	
011857 – 012559	Chairman Mr IP Wai-ming Administration	Mr IP Wai-ming considered that EPD was not sincere in addressing the concerns of the local residents, as evidenced by its inclination to imply that the SENT Landfill was not the source of odour. He said that if the odour problem remained unresolved, Members belonging to the Hong Kong Federation of Trade Unions would not give their support to the Amendment Order. He enquired whether the Administration would consider subsidizing private waste collection operators in retrofitting their RCVs. 		The Administration highlighted the Government's commitment in managing MSW in Hong Kong, and stressed that many TKO residents and students had changed their view about landfills after they visited the SENT Landfill under the outreach programme for TKO District. In response to Mr IP, the Administration undertook to follow up with the waste collection trade on Government's subsidy in retrofitting private RCVs.	
012600 – 013113	Chairman Mr Albert CHAN Administration	Mr Albert CHAN expressed grave concern that the Administration had not taken any actions to address the odour problem until the proposed SENT Landfill extension project was put forward. The measures of providing free full-body vehicle washing for RCVs and the additional flushing and sweeping of Wan Po Road were some examples. He urged the Administration to implement the measures even if the Amended Order was eventually repealed.	
		The Administration clarified that the SENT Landfill extension would still proceed even if the Amendment Order was repealed and the 5 ha of land would not be excised for landfilling purpose. In that event, the Administration assured members that it would continue to implement the said measures.
