Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme

Thank your for your interest in the captioned Scheme. I am pleased to inform you that the 2010/11 exercise of the Scheme was successfully concluded. Details of the selection process, as well as the results of the Scheme, are listed below for your reference.

The Research Grants Council (RGC) launched the first-ever Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (the Fellowship) in September 2009 to attract the best and brightest students around the world (including Hong Kong) to pursue their PhD studies and research in UGC-funded institutions. A total of 2 996 applications from 100 countries / regions worldwide were received. The seven participating institutions, namely City University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong Baptist University, Lingnan University, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, and The University of Hong Kong, nominated 370 applicants to compete for the Fellowship.

The RGC set up two Selection Panels, namely Science, Medicine, Engineering and Technology Panel and Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies Panel, for selecting awardees of the Fellowship. There are a total of 36 members for the two panels, comprising 21 overseas and 15 local academics who had good experience in recruitment of research postgraduate students for top-notch institutions. To avoid any conflict of interest, the local

academics conducted assessment of the applications by means of a blind review. Furthermore, 16 overseas Panel Members came to Hong Kong in late February to assess the shortlisted applications at a two-day meeting.

It is encouraging that the debut of the scheme has attracted such outstanding applicants. The RGC decided to offer Fellowships to the best qualified applicants who could also gain admittance to the top universities in the world. After a rigorous evaluation process, 148 candidates were offered the Fellowship and 115 have accepted. Among these awardees, 71 (62%) candidates are from the Mainland and 10 (9%) from Hong Kong. The remaining 34 (29%) come from other parts of the world – including 11% from Europe, 10% from other Asian countries, 5% from America, 2% from Africa, and 1% from Australia. Most of the awardees will study in the fields of Engineering (31%) and Physical Sciences (27%), while the rest will study in areas relating to Biology and Medicine (16%) and Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies (26%). A summary of the awardees statistics is set out at **Annex**.

In view of the high quality awardees in the first round exercise, we believe that it is a good starting point for our Scheme to establish its reputation, and for Hong Kong to be known as an ideal place for students to pursue their research careers. We hope that in the near future, together with the increasing achievements of Hong Kong institutions in the tertiary education sector worldwide, the 'Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme' will be one of the most desired scholarships among elite students from around the world.
