Proposed timing for discussion

1. Effectiveness of Quality Reform for Piling Works

January 2010

The Administration would like to brief members on the quality reform measures that have been implemented by the Housing Authority in enhancing the quality of the piling works since 2000, and the improvements achieved in different aspects of piling works for public housing projects.

2. Marking Scheme for Estate Management Enforcement in Public Housing Estates

January 2010 (New item proposed by the Administration)

The Administration would inform members of the progress of implementation of the Marking Scheme for Estate Management Enforcement in Public Housing Estates.

3. Implementation of the new rent adjustment mechanism

January 2010 (New item proposed by the Administration)

The Administration would like to brief members on the *by the Administration*) progress of the first rent review under the new rent adjustment mechanism and its approved methodology.

4. Setting up of Tenants Purchase Scheme (TPS) Advisory Team

February 2010 (New item proposed by the Administration)

The Administration would like to brief members on the setting up and progress of TPS Advisory Team to provide educational service on good practices of maintenance and management for owners of TPS estates for a period of two years with effect from 15 June 2009.

Proposed timing for discussion

5. Measures to increase the greening ratio of new public rental housing estates and the provision of recreational facilities in existing estates

February 2010 (New item proposed by the Administration)

The Administration would like to report to members on various measures to increase the greening ratio of all new public rental housing estates to at least 20%, and the provision of recreational facilities in existing estates to cope with the changing population structure.

6. Review of the Waiting List Income and Asset Limits

March 2010

The Housing Authority reviews the Waiting List Income and Asset Limits annually. The Administration would brief members on the outcome of the 2010/11 review. The approved new limits will take effect from April 2010.

7. New initiatives for barrier free access in new housing estates

March 2010 (New item proposed by the Administration)

The Administration would like to report to members on the new measures to cope with the requirements of the latest Barrier Free Access Code.

8. Outcome of the first rent review

June / July 2010

The Administration would like to inform members on the outcome of the first rent review under the new rent adjustment mechanism.

Proposed timing for discussion

9. Thematic greening for the urban area in and adjoining Choi Wan Road, Jordan Valley and Lower Ngau Tau Kok

The project is to support the public housing development at Choi Wan Road/Jordan Valley and the redevelopment of existing Lower Ngau Tau Kok Estate. It serves to bring noticeable improvements to the urban areas through enhancement of greening to slopes, streetscape and pedestrian linkages. The project is scheduled to commence in December 2010. The Administration would seek the Panel's support to obtain funds from the Legislative Council Public Works Subcommittee in November 2010 and Finance Committee in December 2010.
