Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress Report – August 2010

Purpose

This paper is the monthly update on the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) System.

Enrolment

2. The estimated enrolment statistics are as follows:

3. The enrolment rates of employers, employees and SEPs remained stable. As at the end of August 2010, 17 300 employers, 361 400 employees and 19 000 SEPs were registered under the Industry Schemes¹.

Complaint Handling

<u>Complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA) on system operation</u>

4. In August 2010, 410 complaints were received by the MPFA, of which 375 complaints were made against 291 employers. The nature of the complaints received was as follows:

Complaints received by the Labour Department ("LD")

- 5. In August 2010, the LD received 26 MPF-related complaints, all of which were related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages and default contribution.
- 6. Of the 172 complaints received in 2010 (until the end of August):
 - 59 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
 - 68 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal/ Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board for adjudication;
 - 2 cases where the employers were insolvent were referred to the Legal Aid Department, the Official Receiver's Office and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund;
 - 40 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation result; and
 - 3 cases were awaiting the employee's decision on whether to lodge claim with the LD for conciliation.

Enforcement

7. The MPFA continued to enforce the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance ("MPFSO") by investigating complaints, inspecting employment premises, making claims at law courts on behalf of employees to recover outstanding default contributions, and prosecuting employers who are in breach of MPFSO.

Education and Publicity

- 9. The MPF Investment Education Campaign continued in August 2010 to publicize the messages of the six major decision points of a scheme member's MPF investment journey to the general public. A series of 60-second messages entitled "通識 60 秒" was broadcast on a radio station. To tie in with the launch of the radio segments, key messages carried in the radio segments were published weekly in a free newspaper.
- 10. With a view to promoting part-time employees' rights and responsibilities under the MPF System, a thematic campaign was rolled out. A leaflet was produced and distributed to the targeted scheme members and the public via labour unions, government departments and other distribution channels. In addition, eight contribution articles on the subject were published in different media channels including newspapers, a magazine and a recruitment website.
- 11. Youth education activities continued. A contribution article on the MPF System and MPF investment was published in August in the Prospect Guide of Hok Yau Club which was distributed to this year's Form Five graduates. Selected winning entries of the "Parenting Creative Drawing Competition for Kindergarten Kids" were displayed at the Community Art Gallery of an MTR station in August to encourage youngsters to cultivate a good habit of saving for the future.
- 12. To equip scheme members with the knowledge to make informed choices for MPF investment, 16 MPF briefing sessions were conducted for civil servants, members of a professional body, union members, employees and the general public. Moreover, MPFA representatives also attended two dinner gatherings organized by labour unions to disseminate MPF messages
- 13. On the media front, the MPFA issued 17 press releases regarding its enforcement actions. Furthermore, 18 articles contributed by the MPFA on the MPF System and MPF investment were carried in different media.
