<u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

- 2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> received views from 20 deputations on the Hong Kong section of the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (XRL). The deputations expressed the following major concerns and requests -
  - (a) representatives who were Choi Yuen Tsuen (CYT) villagers attending the meeting expressed strong opposition to the land resumption and clearance at CYT. They invited the Subcommittee to take note of the five fundamental principles on protecting CYT as stated in their submission (LC Paper No. CB(1)400/09-10(04)). They requested the Administration to take into account the five principles in working out a feasible option of the way forward for consideration by the affected villagers;
  - (b) residents of Tai Kok Tsui expressed concerns on the impact on their property as a result of the resumption or temporary occupation of underground strata along the alignment for the construction of the railway tunnel. They requested that the Urban Renewal Authority should consider undertaking an integrated redevelopment exercise for the district; and
  - (c) residents of Wonderland Villas also expressed grave concern about the impact of the construction works and the future operation of the express link on the structural safety of buildings. They expressed strong dissatisfaction with the lack of any information provided by the Administration on compensation regarding the strata resumption affecting two blocks of Wonderland Villas.

3. While members had no strong views on the special ex-gratia rehousing package, <u>members</u> urged the Administration to provide necessary assistance to CYT villagers as far as possible to help them maintain their established community neighbourhood network and their lifestyle of "living merged with farming" (耕住合一). <u>Some members</u> including Mr KAM Nai-wai and Mr LEE Wing-tat requested the Administration to find suitable agricultural sites for those affected villagers who wished to continue to farm after the clearance of CYT.

- 4. The Administration explained that the proposed arrangement would have the implication of acknowledging the status of existing temporary domestic squatter structures, which would be inconsistent with the current squatter control policy and have far-reaching implications to the community. The Administration explained that the ex-gratia cash allowance of \$600,000 for each qualified household would enable these households to continue to farm and re-establish homes on suitable agricultural land elsewhere if they wished to. In addition, the Administration would work together with Heung Yee Kuk in providing appropriate necessary assistance to CYT farmers.
- 5. Mr Albert CHAN said that while he was opposed to the proposed project, he noted that the current special ex-gratia rehousing package offered better compensation options to affected households than those available under existing mechanism.

#### Scheduling of further meetings for discussion on the XRL project

- 6. <u>Members</u> noted that the Administration had submitted a paper attaching three draft Public Works Subcommittee (PWSC) papers on special ex-gratia payments, the construction of the railway works and non-railway works respectively to the Subcommittee on the previous day. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Administration intended to submit the papers to PWSC for consideration on 2 December 2009. She sought members' views on the need for the Subcommittee to hold additional meetings for discussion of the draft PWSC papers. <u>Members</u> agreed and <u>the Chairman</u> further proposed to hold meetings on the following dates -
  - (a) 10:45 am on 16 November 2009;
  - (b) 2:30 pm on 17 November 2009; and
  - (c) 9:00 am 12:00 pm on 21 November 2009 (if necessary).

<u>Members</u> agreed to schedule the above meetings. As such, <u>members</u> noted that the next meeting would be held on 16 November 2009 at 10:45 am to discuss the three draft PWSC papers.

(Post-meeting note: Pursuant to members' decision at the meeting on 16 November 2009, the meeting scheduled for 17 November 2009 was advanced to start at 1:30 pm.)
