ANTIQUITIES AND MONUMENTS (DECLARATION OF MONUMENTS) NOTICE 2009

(Made by the Secretary for Development under section 3(1) of the Antiquities and Monuments Ordinance (Cap. 53) after consultation with the Antiquities Advisory Board and with the approval of the Chief Executive)

1. Declaration of monuments

The following buildings and structures are declared to be monuments—

- (a) the dam, the valve house and the weir of the Wong Nai Chung Reservoir on Hong Kong Island, respectively delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked Plan No. HKM8609 signed and deposited by the Secretary for Development in the Land Registry in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance;
- (b) the following building and structures constructed in connection with the Pok Fu Lam Reservoir on Hong Kong Island—
 - (i) the former Watchman's Cottage, the gauge basin and the masonry bridge, respectively delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked Plan No. HKM8611-1 signed and deposited by the Secretary for Development in the Land Registry in accordance with section 3(4) of the Ordinance;

Explanatory Note

This Notice declares certain buildings and structures constructed in connection with certain reservoirs in Hong Kong to be monuments under the Antiquities and Monuments Ordinance (Cap. 53).

- 2. Those buildings and structures are—
 - (a) the dam, the valve house and the weir of the Wong Nai Chung Reservoir;
 - (b) the former Watchman's Cottage, the gauge basin and 4 masonry bridges constructed in connection with the Pok Fu Lam Reservoir;
 - (c) the dam, the valve house and the masonry aqueduct of the Tai Tam Upper Reservoir, the masonry bridge adjacent to the aqueduct, and the recorder house (together with the tunnel inlet) situated to the south of the Reservoir;
 - (d) the dam and the valve house of the Tai Tam Byewash Reservoir;
 - (e) the 21-arch section of the aqueduct that forms part of the Bowen Road;

- (f) the dam and the valve house of the Tai Tam Intermediate Reservoir:
- (g) the dam, the valve house and the memorial stone of the Tai Tam Tuk Reservoir and 4 masonry bridges that stretch across the Reservoir;
- (h) the Tai Tam Tuk Raw Water Pumping Station, the Tai Tam Tuk Raw Water Pumping Station Staff Quarters, the Tai Tam Tuk Raw Water Pumping Station No. 2 Staff Quarters, the Tai Tam Tuk Raw Water Pumping Station Senior Staff Quarters, and the structure comprising a flue and a chimney shaft and constructed in connection with the Tai Tam Tuk Raw Water Pumping Station;
- (i) the dam of the Aberdeen Upper Reservoir, the bridge connecting to the dam and the valve house of the Aberdeen Upper Reservoir;
- (j) the dam of the Aberdeen Lower Reservoir;
- (k) the main dam, the main dam valve house, the spillway dam and the 2 recorder houses, including the spillway dam recorder house, of the Kowloon Reservoir; and
- (1) the memorial stone of the Shing Mun Reservoir.
