- (b) the Yan Tun Kong Study Hall at Ping Shan Hang Tau Lot Nos. 126 and 148 in D.D. 122 and Lot Nos. 515 and 1600 in D.D. 122, Hang Tau Tsuen, Ping Shan, Yuen Long, New Territories, and the adjoining land, as delineated and shown edged red on the plan marked Plan No. YLM6953a signed and deposited in the Land Registry under section 3(4) of the Ordinance by the Secretary for Development.
