The Bills Committee deliberated (Index of proceedings attached at Annex).

Meeting with deputations and the Administration

- 2. <u>The Bills Committee</u> received views from the representatives of 11 deputations attending the meeting. <u>Members</u> noted the following major views and concerns expressed by the representatives
 - (a) while the deputations in general supported the legislative intent of the Bill to enhance the safety of public light bus (PLB) operation, some of them considered that the new safety measures might have a labeling effect on PLBs. They considered that it would be fairer if the new safety measures would also be applied to all classes of vehicles;
 - (b) PLB operators were concerned that, as the PLB trade was already facing a manpower shortage and lack of new entrants, the proposed mandatory attendance at pre-service course under the Bill might further deter people from applying for the PLB driving licence;
 - (c) whether the proposal of mandatory installation of electronic data recording device (EDRD) would further lift the operational cost of the PLB operators, who were also striving to cope with other high operational costs (e.g. insurance premium);
 - (d) some deputations requested the Administration to provide subsidy to PLB owners to meet the costs to be incurred by the new safety measures proposed under the Bill and to applicants for attending the pre-service course;

- (e) some deputations expressed concern as to whether there was a genuine need for mandating the installation of speed limiter and EDRD on PLBs under the Bill in addition to the existing legal requirement for installing speed display device (SDD). Some suggested that with the mandatory installation of EDRD, mandatory installation of speed limiter or SDD should not be required;
- (f) some deputations anticipated that there might be difficulties in law enforcement against speeding as there were different maximum speed limits applicable to different classes of vehicles on the same road; and
- (g) the proposed fine level of \$2,000 for the offence of failure to display PLBs driver identity plate was considered by some deputations as too heavy.

Follow-up actions required of the Administration

- Admin 3. To facilitate further discussion on the Bill, <u>the Administration</u> was requested to provide the following information
 - (a) response to some members' view that the Administration should explore if there was any appropriate arrangement such as employee re-training scheme to provide some form of government subsidy for applicants enrolling on the pre-service course;
 - (b) the numbers of traffic accidents involving PLBs before and after the introduction of administrative measures in June 2010 to require the installation of a speed limiter on all PLBs, including a breakdown of the numbers by categories of PLBs installed with speed limiters and those without;
 - (c) overseas experience of any decrease in traffic accident rate after introducing mandatory installation of EDRD; and
 - (d) response to the transport sectors' concern as to whether there was a genuine need to mandate the installation of the speed limiter, EDRD and SDD altogether, and further elaboration on the benefits in enhancing safety that could be brought about by the mandatory installation of EDRD on PLBs.
