6. <u>The Chairman</u> put the motion to vote and <u>Mr CHAN Wai-yip</u> claimed a division. Nine members voted in favour of the motion, 13 members voted against the motion and one member abstained from voting. The motion was negatived.

Dr Margaret NG considered that the Administration should explain comprehensively the policy aspects of the Bill, and conduct a wide consultation on the Bill as it had proposed a fundamental change which would have significant impact on the existing election system. Mr IP Kwok-him held the view that there had	
		been adequate discussion in society on the subject since the five Members had resigned at will to force a so-called "referendum" in January 2010. In response to Dr Margaret NG's criticism that the Bills Committee had not followed the normal practice in scrutinizing a bill, the Chairman's remarks that he followed all the rules of procedures and practices in chairing the meetings of the Bills Committee for the scrutiny work.

The Administration's proposal was a response to the public demand. Mr IP Kwok-him echoed Ms Miriam LAU's views about the expressions used by members in criticizing other members at the meeting. Dr Priscilla LEUNG advised that she might consider proposing amendments to the Bill so that those situations which were outside the control of the Member (e.g. death of a Member or when a Member lost the ability to discharge his duties as a result of serious illness) would be excluded from the application of the proposed replacement mechanism.
