Proposed amendment to motion on "Post-office employment arrangements for politically appointed officials"

Motion debate on "Post-office employment arrangements for politically appointed officials" to be held at the Legislative Council meeting of Wednesday, 12 January 2011

1. Dr Hon Margaret NG's original motion

That, as politically appointed officials have greater access to sensitive information and stronger influence on policy formulation than directorate civil servants, the control over the post-office employment of politically appointed officials should correspondingly be more stringent than that of directorate civil servants; however, under the existing Code for Principal Officials under the Accountability System, the control over the post-office employment of politically appointed officials is very loose; in this connection, this Council urges the Government to review the vetting system for the post-office employment of politically appointed officials, including introducing a sanitization period, extending the control period, and setting up an independent and highly transparent vetting and approving committee to vet politically appointed officials' applications for post-office employment, so as to allay public concern about any possible conflicts between accountability officials' exercise of powers and responsibilities and their pursuit of private interests, and to maintain public confidence in the governance of the HKSAR Government.

2. Motion as amended by Dr Hon Philip WONG Yu-hong

That, as politically appointed officials have greater access to sensitive information and stronger influence on policy formulation than directorate civil servants, the control over the post-office employment of politically appointed officials should eorrespondingly be more stringent than that of directorate civil servants be very stringent; however, under the existing Code for Principal Officials under the Accountability System, the control over the post-office employment of politically appointed officials is very loose; in this connection, this Council urges the Government to review the vetting system for the post-office employment of politically appointed officials, including introducing a sanitization period, extending the control period, and setting up an independent and highly transparent vetting and approving committee to vet

politically appointed officials' applications for post-office employment, so as to allay less stringent than the existing control over the post-service work of directorate civil servants; although politically appointed officials are different from civil servants in that they do not enjoy any security of tenure, in order to avoid public concern about any possible conflicts between accountability officials' exercise of powers and responsibilities and their pursuit of private interests, and to maintain public confidence in the governance of the HKSAR Government, this Council urges the Government to expeditiously conduct a review of this issue.
