#### Action

The Chairman reported that a total of three capital works projects amounting to \$912 million had been endorsed by the Public Works Subcommittee (PWSC) in the 2010-2011 session so far.

#### **Capital Works Reserve Fund Block Allocations**

PWSC(2010-11)19 — Block allocations for Heads 701 to 711 under the Capital Works Reserve Fund

- 2. The Chairman advised that the proposal was to seek approval of a total allocation of \$11,426.9 million for the block allocations for Heads 701 to 711 under the Capital Works Reserve Fund for 2011-2012. The funding proposals in PWSC(2010-11)19 had been circulated to the Panel on Development on 12 November 2010, and Panel members had not raised any objections to the proposals. The Office of the Government Chief Information Officer had also consulted the Panel on Information Technology and Broadcasting (ITB Panel) on the proposed allocation for the block vote under "Head 710- Computerization" on 8 November 2010, and Panel members supported the funding proposal. The gist of discussion at the ITB Panel was tabled at the meeting.
- 3. The item was voted on and endorsed.

# Head 703 – Buildings

PWSC(2010-11)20 13NT Conversion of aqua privies into flushing toilets—phase 7

4. <u>The Chairman</u> advised that the proposal was to upgrade 13NT to Category A at an estimated cost of \$383.3 million in money-of-the-day

- (MOD) prices for the conversion of 145 aqua privies into flushing toilets. The Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene had been consulted on the proposal at its meeting on 9 November 2010, and Panel members supported the proposal. The gist of Panel discussion was tabled at the meeting.
- 5. Mr IP Kwok-him noted that the remaining 50 aqua privies which were not included in the conversion programme were due to problems such as sitting on private land, site constraints, possible reprovisioning or demolition as a result of other works projects. He questioned whether these aqua privies were located in tourist spots or places commonly frequented.
- 6. <u>Under Secretary for Food and Health</u> (USFH) responded that the proposed arrangements for the 50 aqua privies were as follows: two were to be converted into flushing toilets as recently confirmed, six were to be refurbished in-situ, 13 were to be demolished, six were to be reprovisioned, 23 were pending further consideration because of problems such as private land issues. He confirmed that all these aqua privies were not situated in tourist spots.
- 7. Mr CHEUNG Hok-ming asked whether the Administration would consider resuming land or seeking consent from the landlord concerned in handling the 23 aqua privies, if these sat on private land. <u>USFH</u> replied that each case would be handled based on individual circumstances such as the site conditions of aqua privies, the land lease and boundary, and the historical reasons for setting up the aqua privies. <u>USFH</u> believed that the chances of resuming land for such conversion would be very unlikely.
- 8. The item was voted on and endorsed.

PWSC(2010-11)21 180IC Fitting-out works for Government facilities at new air cargo terminal

9. The Chairman advised that the proposal was to upgrade 180IC to Category A at an estimated cost of \$174.3 million in MOD prices for carrying out fitting-out works for Government facilities at a new air cargo terminal at the Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA). The Panel on Economic Development had been consulted on the proposal at its meeting on 22 November 2010, and Panel members supported the proposal in principle. The gist of Panel discussion was tabled at the meeting. The Chairman further advised that as requested by the Panel, the Administration had provided supplementary information, in paragraph 15 of PWSC(2010-11)21, on the competitiveness of HKIA vis-à-vis the airports in Guangzhou and

Shenzhen in terms of the aviation network and cargo handling capacity per annum.
