I. Confirmation of the minutes of the 24th meeting held on 27 May 2011 (LC Paper No. CB(2) 1923/10-11)

## II. Matters arising

# Report by the Chairman on the meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration

2. <u>The Chairman</u> said that there was nothing special to report.

## III. Business arising from previous Council meetings

(a) Legal Service Division report on bill referred to the House Committee in accordance with Rule 54(4)

## **Pyramid Schemes Prohibition Bill**

(LC Paper No. LS 70/10-11)

3. The Chairman said that the Bill sought to repeal the Pyramid Selling Prohibition Ordinance (Cap. 355) and introduce a new regulatory regime to prohibit pyramid schemes irrespective of whether they involved the marketing of goods or services. The Panel on Economic Development had been briefed on the legislative proposals at its meeting on 28 March 2011, and members generally supported the proposals.

- 4. <u>Mr Vincent FANG</u> considered it necessary to form a Bills Committee to study the Bill in detail. <u>Members</u> agreed. The following Members agreed to join the Bills Committee: Mr Fred LI, Mr Vincent FANG, Ms Cyd HO, Mr CHEUNG Kwok-che and Miss Tanya CHAN.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> said that as the Bills Committee on Motor Vehicles (First Registration Tax) (Amendment) Bill 2011 had provided its written report for the House Committee meeting, there would be a vacant slot. The Bills Committee could commence work immediately.
- (b) Legal Service Division report on subsidiary legislation gazetted on 27 May 2011 and tabled in Council on 1 June 2011 (LC Paper No. LS 69/10-11)
- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> said that only one item of subsidiary legislation, i.e. the Designation of Libraries Order 2011, was gazetted on 27 May 2011 and tabled in the Council on 1 June 2011.
- 7. <u>Members</u> did not raise any queries on the Order.
- 8. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that the deadline for amending the Order was 29 June 2011.

# IV. Legal Service Division report on two orders made under section 78B of the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance gazetted on 31 May and 2 June 2011

(LC Paper No. LS 71/10-11)

- 9. The Chairman said that the two Orders sought to prohibit all persons from importing into and supplying within Hong Kong the food specified in Annex A to the Orders that was intended for human consumption for the period from 12:00 noon on 31 May 2011 and 12:00 noon on 2 June 2011 respectively until further notice. The specified food were two drink products and a konjac coconut jelly product originated from Taiwan. The two Orders were not subsidiary legislation. As such, they were not required to be tabled before the Legislative Council ("LegCo") and were not subject to amendment by LegCo.
- 10. <u>The Chairman</u> further said that Members would have the opportunity to discuss the matter as the Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene had included an item on "Briefing on measures to follow up on the Plasticizer contamination incident in Taiwan" in the agenda for its meeting scheduled for 14 June 2011, at 2:00 pm.
- 11. <u>Members</u> did not raise any queries on the two Orders.

## V. Further business for the Council meeting of 8 June 2011

## (a) <u>Tabling of papers</u>

Report No. 24/10-11 of the House Committee on Consideration of Subsidiary Legislation and Other Instruments

(LC Paper No. CB(2) 1925/10-11 issued vide LC Paper No. CB(3) 823/10-11 dated 1 June 2011)

- 12. The Chairman said that the report covered one item of subsidiary legislation, i.e. the Tramway Ordinance (Alteration of Fares) (Amendment) Notice 2011, the period for amendment of which would expire on 8 June 2011. Upon the expiry of the deadline, a Member had indicated intention to speak on the Notice at the Council meeting. As such, she would move a motion in her capacity as Chairman of the House Committee to take note of the Report in relation to the Notice at the Council meeting of 8 June 2011.
- 13. In response to Dr Margaret NG's enquiry, the Chairman said that the speaking time limit was 15 minutes for each Member at the debate.

15. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Administration had given notice to present the above Bill to the Council on 8 June 2011. The House Committee would consider the Bill at its next meeting on 10 June 2011.
