Speech by the Secretary for Home Affairs in the Legislative Council on 30 March 2011

Resolution under section 7(a) of the Legal Aid Ordinance (Cap. 91) Financial Eligibility Limits of the Legal Aid Applicants

President,

I move the Resolution standing in my name on the agenda.

In accordance with section 5 and 5A of the Legal Aid Ordinance, a person whose disposable financial resources do not exceed \$175,800 is financially eligible for legal aid under the Ordinary Legal Aid Scheme. The corresponding limit for the Supplementary Legal Aid Scheme is \$488,400.

We have completed the five-yearly review of the criteria for assessing the financial eligibility of legal aid applicants. In response to calls from the community, and having considered the views from the Legal Aid Services Council, the Legislative Council Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services, the legal profession and relevant stakeholders, we now propose the Resolution to adjust upward the limit for the Ordinary Scheme from \$175,800 to \$260,000, and that for the Supplementary Scheme from \$488,400 to \$1.3 million.

I invite Members to support the Resolution.
