- Admin 2. To facilitate members' discussion at the next meeting, the <u>Administration</u> was requested to
  - (a) propose amendment to section 13(3) of the REA Regulation in the light of the wording suggested by Assistant Legal Adviser at the meeting;
  - (b) consider members' views that sections 15 and 16 should be amended to the effect that lay persons could be appointed to the disciplinary board;
  - (c) amend section 18(4) to expressly provide that the legal cost incurred under section 18(4) would be met by general revenue;

- (d) include in the speech to be delivered by the Secretary for the Environment the coverage of the "costs or expenses of the hearing" and the "costs or expenses of the Director or any other person in the proceedings" under section 19(2); and
- (e) in respect of the disciplinary proceedings under the REA Regulation, to advise on the standard of proof adopted and who would be charged with the responsibility to provide evidence.

3. <u>Members</u> noted that the next meeting would be held on Monday, 7 March 2011, at 8:30 am to continue discussion with the Administration.

To keep up with the times, he shared the views of Prof Patrick LAU that the disciplinary board panel should be expanded to include a lay person category. Members agreed that there was no need to increase the number of members of a disciplinary board, which was proposed to be five. However, it should be specified that one of five members had to be from the lay person category. The Administration agreed to follow up this matter.
