

**Subcommittee on the Public Revenue Protection  
(Dutiable Commodities) Order 2011**

**Supplementary Information Provided by the Administration**

**Purpose**

This paper provides supplementary information on various issues in response to the request made by Members at the meeting of the Subcommittee on the Public Revenue Protection (Dutiable Commodities) Order 2011 held on 8 April.

**Smoking Pattern in Hong Kong**

2. Members requested information on the breakdown of the number of smokers in Hong Kong by age group, gender and the period of time they had been smoking. Statistics from surveys on smoking pattern conducted by the Census and Statistics Department (C&SD) showed the age that smokers started smoking cigarette weekly, as opposed to the period of time they had been smoking. The statistics indicate that the vast majority of smokers started smoking below the age of 30 and more than half of smokers started smoking below the age of 20. A table showing the breakdown of the number of smokers in Hong Kong in the last two surveys by age group, gender and the age they started smoking weekly is at **Annex A**.

3. Members also requested for the size of smoking population over the years, including the actual number and percentage changes by year. The table on smoking pattern in the Administration's paper LC Paper No. CB(1)1819/10-11(02) is updated with the requested information at **Annex B**. On the request for supplementary information to detail the decline in the percentage of daily smokers in the younger age groups of 15-19 and 20-29 in the respective years as stated in Annex C to the Administration's paper LC Paper No. CB(1)1819/10-11(02), the Administration is compiling the relevant information and will provide a separate response in due course.

**Smoking Cessation Services**

4. Members requested information on the details of the financial provision for smoking prevention and cessation services and all the fees charged (including registration fee) for the smoking cessation services provided by the Department of Health (DH) and the Hospital Authority (HA), and the waiting time for utilizing such services.

### Financial Provision for Smoking Prevention and Cessation

5. For smoking prevention and cessation services provided by the Tobacco Control Office (TCO) of DH as well as non-government organizations (NGO) with which DH has entered into service agreement, the financial provision are shown in the breakdown of expenditures of TCO for tobacco control from 2008-09 to 2011-12 at **Annex C**. The resources for smoking prevention and cessation related activities have been increasing over the years, and an additional funding of \$21 million has been earmarked in 2011-12 for enhancement of smoking prevention and cessation services as part of primary care. It should be noted that various services of DH other than TCO also contribute to the provision of health promotion activities relating to tobacco control and smoking cessation services. These form an integral part of the respective services of DH and breakdown of the expenditure for such services is not available.

6. Apart from DH and its NGO partners, HA also provides smoking cessation services. These form an integral part of the overall service provision of HA and breakdown of the expenditure for such services is not available. However, a total of \$19.6 million has been specifically earmarked in the funding for HA in 2011-12 for enhancement of HA's smoking cessation service in the primary care setting. In particular, HA will provide smoking cessation services in 2011-12 targeting chronic disease patients who are smokers using the chronic care model in primary care setting. The focus is to improve disease management and complication prevention through smoking cessation interventions including face-to-face behavioural support, telephone counseling, and pharmacotherapy.

7. Over the years, the Administration has been increasing the allocation of resources to areas of work in relation to tobacco control including smoking prevention and cessation. Together with the subvention to the Council on Smoking and Health and other non-government organizations, TCO's expenditure for tobacco control has increased from \$35.8 million in 2008-09 to \$76.7 million in 2011-12, representing 114% increase over a period of four years. This has yet to take into account expenditure on smoking cessation by HA for which we have no separate breakdown.

### Fee Charging for Smoking Cessation Services

8. DH operates a total of five smoking cessation clinics, four of which are targeting civil servants and one is open to members of the public. Services provided at these clinics include individual and group counselling for smokers, prescription of Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) or other non-NRT medications to manage nicotine dependence. The service charge for "Eligible Persons"<sup>1</sup> is \$100 for the first attendance, \$60 per subsequent attendance and \$10 per drug item. A medical fee

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<sup>1</sup> Patients falling into the following categories are eligible for the rates of charges applicable to "Eligible Persons": (i) a holder of Hong Kong Identity Card issued under the Registration of Persons Ordinance; (ii) children who are Hong Kong residents and under 11 years of age; (iii) other persons approved by the Director of Health.

waiver mechanism<sup>2</sup> is applicable to patients of DH's clinics who have difficulties in paying the fees. As at April 2011, clients will be given a smoking cessation service appointment within three weeks after a successful referral has been made.

9. DH has entered into a funding and service agreement with the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals (TWGHs) for the provision of a community-based smoking cessation programme. There are currently four centres operating throughout the territory to provide free smoking cessation services, where clinically necessary NRT drugs are prescribed free-of-charge. DH has also entered into a funding and service agreement with Pok Oi Hospital (POH) for the provision of a smoking cessation pilot programme using acupuncture in Chinese Medicine. Free smoking cessation service is provided in 15 mobile clinics which serve 70 locations in different districts. Clients will receive smoking cessation services comprising assessment, counselling and follow-up, within 3 working days from the Integrated Smoking Cessation Centres of TWGHs and Traditional Chinese Medicine Mobile Clinics of POH.

10. HA operates 34 smoking cessation clinics, among which 3 are operated full-time and the rest provide services at specified timeslots. The fee of an Eligible person for attending a face-to-face counselling session under the HA's Smoking Cessation & Counselling Programme (SCCP) is \$45, which includes drug therapies prescribed under the Programme. Telephone counselling session is free of charge. The HA's Medical Fee Waiver Mechanism<sup>3</sup> is also applicable under this Programme. Under the SCCP, smokers who intend to quit smoking will be offered professional counselling services by trained counselors and pharmacotherapy if indicated. Since August 2010, for patients clinically indicated, according to the management protocol, drug therapies such as NRT and Varenicline are prescribed free of charge. The waiting time for individual smoking cessation centres may differ due to differences in service demands and operational conditions. In general, new cases can be seen within four weeks.

#### Addresses and Service Hours of Smoking Cessation Services

11. Members requested for the addresses and service hours of the smoking cessation clinics and centres under DH, HA and the relevant non-governmental organizations. These are set out at **Annex D**.

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<sup>2</sup> Under the medical fee waiver mechanism of DH, patients who are recipients of Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) recipients will have their fees waived. Those who are not recipients of CSSA but have financial difficulties to pay their medical fees may apply to Medical Social Worker (MSW) of the Social Welfare Department (SWD) for waivers.

<sup>3</sup> Under the medical fee waiver mechanism of HA, patients who are recipients of CSSA will have their medical fees waived. Those who are not recipients of CSSA but have financial difficulties to pay their medical fees may apply for a medical fee waiver at the Medical Social Services Units of public hospitals and clinics.
