I. Election of Chairman

Mr TAM Yiu-chung was elected Chairman of the Subcommittee.

II. Meeting with the Administration

- 2. The Subcommittee deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 3. The Subcommittee requested the Administration to provide -
 - (a) the details of the proposed ex-gratia allowance package to the affected trawler fishermen, including the principles and formula to be used for calculating the package, and the eligibility criteria for the ex-gratia allowance; and the details of the proposed one-off grant to those affected local deckhands;
 - (b) a list showing areas of consensus reached with the affected trawler fishermen and controversy about the proposed ex-gratia allowance package;

- (c) information on the visit by the Permanent Secretary for Food and Health to the Mainland in April 2011 to reflect Hong Kong fishermen's views on developing capture fisheries in Mainland waters and exchange views on ways to enhance liaison and co-operation on fisheries development between the two places;
- (d) figure on the fish catch in local waters;
- (e) a response to Mr Albert CHAN's suggestion to impose regulation on mesh size in fishing nets;
- (f) a response to some members' suggestions to expand the designated marine fish culture zones to facilitate trawler fishermen to switch to marine fish culture operations; and
- (g) information on measures to strengthen law enforcement against illegal fishing by non-local fishing vessels.
- 4. <u>Mr WONG Kwok-hing</u> expressed regret and dissatisfaction with the Administration's refusal to consider providing interest-free loan to the affected fishermen to help them switch to sustainable fisheries or related operations. <u>Mr WONG</u> stated that he would continue to fight for interest-free terms for the affected fishermen.
- 5. The Under Secretary for Food and Health agreed to reflect to the relevant Mainland authorities the view of Mr WONG Yung-kan that the use of destructive fishing devices should not be allowed.

III. Date of next meeting

6. Noting that the Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene ("the Panel") had just received views from deputations/academics on the proposed trawl ban at its special meeting on 15 March 2011, the Subcommittee considered it unnecessary to invite public views on the Amendment Notice. At the request of members, the Chairman asked the Clerk to provide the members who are not members of the Panel with the written submissions from deputations/academics on the proposal for their information.

(*Post-meeting note*: the written submissions from deputations/academics on the proposed trawl ban were circulated on 14 April 2011.)

- 7. <u>The Subcommittee</u> agreed that the next meeting be scheduled for 3 May 2011 at 2:30 pm.
