Action

I. Meeting with the Administration

[Legislative Council Brief, L.N. 111 of 2011, L.N. 112 of 2011, LC Paper Nos. LS86/10-11, CB(2)2374/10-11(02), CB(2)2500/10-11(01) and CB(2)83/11-12(01) to (02)]

<u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. <u>The Chairman</u> drew members' attention to the Administration's paper on the Small and Medium Enterprises Loan Guarantee Scheme ("SGS").

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<u>The Administration</u> affirmed that eligible operators of residential care homes for persons with disabilities ("RCHDs") could apply for SGS. <u>Members</u> called on the Social Welfare Department ("SWD") to invite representatives of the Trade and Industry Department to join the briefing sessions for the private RCHD operators on the licensing scheme and explain to the RCHD sector the eligibility criteria for SGS such that the operators might consider applying for the loan to meet the compliance costs.

<u>Continuation of the scrutiny of the Residential Care Homes (Persons with</u> Disabilities) Regulation ("the Regulation")

Section 24 - Accessibility

3. Responding to the legal adviser to the Subcommittee's enquiry, <u>the Administration</u> advised that accessibility under section 24 refers to the accessibility by emergency services. The provision of accessible lifts was not a mandatory requirement for the purpose thereof.

Section 25 - Heating, lighting and ventilation

4. In response to the Chairman, <u>the Administration</u> explained that there was no specific requirement of a fixed room temperature so as to allow flexibility in operation.

Section 36 – Discharge of residents by operators

5. <u>Ms LI Fung-ying</u> was concerned that the requirement of operators to serve written notice 30 days prior to discharging residents was inadequate for the affected residents to find an alternative RCHD place. <u>The Administration</u> assured members that SWD would continue to provide appropriate assistance for individual affected residents to ensure the well-being of the residents. The 30-day notice requirement was considered appropriate.

Review of the implementation of the licensing scheme

6. <u>Ms Cyd HO</u> was concerned about the possible impact of the licensing scheme on the private RCHD sector and residents. She urged the Administration to closely monitor the implementation of the licensing scheme and report the progress on the implementation of the scheme and related complementary measures in about six months after the

commencement of the licensing scheme. <u>The Administration</u> agreed. <u>The Chairman</u> added that the Administration had previously agreed to report to the Panel on Welfare Services on the implementation progress.

The Administration's proposed amendment

7. <u>Members</u> agreed to the Administration's proposed amendment to section 5(4)(d) of the Regulation to allow a person who initiated a cancellation of registration under the Residential Care Homes (Elderly Persons) Regulation (Cap.459 sub. leg. A) to have a choice to retain his or her registration under the Regulation as a RCHD health worker.

Residential Care Homes (Persons with Disabilities) Ordinance (Commencement) Notice 2011 ("the Commencement Notice")

- 8. <u>Members</u> noted that the Commencement Notice appointed 18 November 2011 as the date on which the Residential Care Homes (Persons with Disabilities) Ordinance ("the Ordinance") (except Part 2) would come into operation. <u>The Administration</u> stressed that there would be a grace period of 18 months starting from the commencement of the Ordinance. During the grace period, no sanction would be imposed on the operation of RCHD without a licence or certificate of exemption ("COE"). The Secretary for Labour and Welfare would issue another commencement notice to the effect that Part 2 of the Ordinance which would create an offence for the operation without a licence/COE would come into operation upon the expiry of the 18-month grace period.
- 9. <u>The Chairman</u> asked about the processing time for a RCHD licence application. <u>The Administration</u> advised that the processing time for a RCHD licence application would take eight weeks upon receipt of all valid documents, with reference to the current practice of the Licensing Office of Residential Care Homes for the Elderly.

Legislative timetable

10. The Chairman said that the Subcommittee had completed the scrutiny of the Regulation and the Commencement Notice. He would make a verbal report on the deliberations of the Subcommittee to the House Committee on 21 October 2011. The Chairman further said that he had given notice to move a motion at the Council meeting of 19 October 2011 to extend the scrutiny period of these two items of subsidiary legislation to 9 November

Action

2011. Should individual members wish to propose amendments to the Regulation and the Commencement Notice, the deadline for giving notice of amendments would be 2 November 2011.

II. Any other business

11. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 11:20 am.
