Public Works Projects approved by the Finance Committee	16.12.2010	The Administration was requested to provide a timetable to show the progress of all the Public Works Projects upgraded to Category A with the approval of the Finance Committee from January 2008 to present. The timetable should show, for each project, the date that the funding was approved, the amount of funding, the date/month that invitation for tender was issued, the date/month that the relevant contract was awarded, the value of the contract, and when the project is expected to complete. Delays, if any, in the schedules, for example, delay in inviting tenders or awarding contracts should be reported with reasons.
