1. PWP Item No. 3400IO – Transformation of the Former Police Married Quarters on Hollywood Road into a creative industries landmark

The Administration intends to seek funding support for the project of "transformation of the former Police Married Quarters on Hollywood Road into a creative industries landmark with conservation works, revitalised facilities and landscaped open space". 20 April 2011

2. Purchase and Conversion of Industrial Buildings for Water Supplies Department Premises

The Administration intends to seek the Panel's view on its plan to purchase and convert industrial buildings to be the New Territories West Regional Office and a new Water Conservation Education Centre of the Water Supplies Department.

20 April 2011

3. Environmentally Friendly Linkage System for the Kai Tak Development

The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the findings of the feasibility study on the above system.

20 April 2011

4. Progress report on the Kai Tak Development and funding proposals for the (i) bio-remediation works of the Kai Tak approach channel, (ii) stage 2 infrastructure works at the north apron and (iii) the reprovisioning of radar on the top of the cruise terminal building

The Administration intends to update the Panel on the progress of the Kai Tak Development and seek funding support for the above works projects.

5. Development of Greening Master Plans for the New Territories

The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the work plan of the Civil Engineering and Development Department for the development of Greening Master Plans for the New Territories and the outcome of the Department's consultation with the District Councils in the New Territories on its proposed approach to the initiative.

6. Proposed amendments to Building (Standards of Sanitary Fitments, Plumbing, Drainage Works and Latrines) Regulations

The Administration intends to introduce members the proposed amendments to the Building of Sanitary (Standards Fitments, Plumbing, Drainage Works and Latrines) Regulations, including the provision of female sanitary facilities. The Administration intends to submit the subsidiary legislation in due course.

2nd Quarter 2011

7. Seismic effects on buildings in Hong Kong

The Administration intends to introduce to members the recommendations of the Buildings Department's consultancy study on seismic effects on buildings in Hong Kong and the proposed way forward. The Administration intends to submit the subsidiary legislation in due course.

2nd Quarter 2011

8. Proposed redevelopment scheme for the West Wing of the Central Government Offices

The subject was discussed at the meetings of the Panel on 27 April and 26 October 2010. A public hearing on the issue was held by the Panel on 23 November 2010. The public consultation on the proposed redevelopment of the West Wing of the Central Government Offices ended on 31 December 2010. The Administration will update the Panel on the way forward for the proposed scheme.

May 2011

9. Revitalization of industrial buildings

The subject was proposed by Miss Tanya CHAN at the Panel meeting on 14 October 2010. She was concerned about the progress of implementation of this initiative.

Mid-2011

10. North East New Territories New Development Areas Planning and Engineering Study

The subject was proposed by Mr LEE Wing-tat. He expressed concern about the proposed comprehensive development and nature conservation enhancement area in the Kwu Tung North New Development Area Preliminary Outline Development Plan.

Mid-2011

The Panel discussed the subject of "Planning and Engineering Study on North East New Territories New Development Areas (NENT NDAs) (Stage One Public Engagement)" at the meeting on 25 November 2008. The Administration briefed the Panel on the Preliminary Outline Development Plans in the Stage Two Public Engagement at the meeting on 24 November 2009.

The Administration provided an update on the NENT NDAs Planning and Engineering Study in its supplementary note on the Planning and Engineering Study on Development of Lok Ma Chau Loop – Investigation – Stage One Public Engagement (LC Paper No. CB(1)735/10-11(04)) in December 2010.

11. Leakage problem of water mains in housing estates

The subject was proposed by Mr WONG Kwok-hing in a letter to the Chairman dated 18 November 2010 (LC Paper No. CB(1)514/10-11(01)). The proposal was discussed at the meeting of the Panel 23 November 2010 and supported. Commission has conducted a review to examine the Water Supplies Department's management of burst and leaks in the water supply and distribution systems and published its recommendations in Report No. 55 of the Director of Audit's Report Legislative (tabled in the Council on 17 November 2010).

Mid-2011

12. Review of the functions of the Town Planning Board and related issues

At the meeting with Legislative Council Members on 29 November 2005, Heung Yee Kuk Councillors raised concern about the mechanism to check and balance the powers of the Town Planning Board. The relevant extract from the minutes of the meeting was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)700/05-06 on 13 January 2006.

To be decided (Note)

At the Panel meeting on 14 October 2008, Miss Tanya CHAN, Ms Cyd HO and Mr Abraham SHEK expressed views that issues related to the review of the functions of the Town Planning Board, town planning procedures, and secretariat support for the Town Planning Board should be discussed.

Note: The Administration has advised that review of the Town Planning Ordinance is not a priority of the Development Bureau and thus has not been factored into its current work plan.

13. Small House Policy

The subject was proposed by Mr CHAN Kam-lam at the meeting on 11 October 2007. A letter from the Chief Secretary for Administration in reply to the Public Accounts Committee (LC Paper No. CB(1)130/07-08(01)) providing information about the progress of the Small House Policy review was circulated to members on 25 October 2007.

To be decided (Note)

At the meeting with Legislative Council Members on 8 January 2009, Heung Yee Kuk Councillors raised concern about the arrangements regarding Small House applications by descendents of indigenous villagers after village removal. The relevant documents (LC Paper No.

CB(1)935/08-09(02)) were circulated to members on 2 March 2009.

Note: The Administration has advised that more time is required for its internal deliberation on the subject and thus it would not be ready to discuss the subject in the near future.
