1. Work of the Urban Renewal Authority

The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the
progress of the work of the Urban Renewal
Authority and its plan for the next financial year.28 June 2011

2. Unauthorized building works in New Territories Exempted Houses

The 28 June 2011 above item proposed by was Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon LEE Wing-tat at the meeting on 20April 2011. In the light of the results of the Ombudsman's investigation into the enforcement regime on unauthorized building works ("UWBs") in New Territories exempted houses ("NTEHs"), they expressed concern about the Buildings Department's practice of taking enforcement actions against UBWs in NTEHs. Members considered that the Administration should be invited to discuss with the Panel the policy and enforcement action against UBWs in NTEHs.

3. Amalgamation of the Construction Industry Council and the Construction Workers Registration Authority

The Administration intends to update the Panel on 28 June 2011 the progress of the preparatory work for the proposed amalgamation of the Construction Industry Council and the Construction Workers Registration Authority.

4. Progress Report on Heritage Conservation Initiatives

The Administration intends to update the Panel on the progress made on various heritage conservation initiatives since its last report in November 2010, to seek members' support for the funding application for the revitalization of the Old Tai Po Police Station, the Blue House Cluster and the Stone Houses under Batch II of the Revitalization Scheme, and to hear their views on future work on heritage conservation.

5. Proposed redevelopment scheme for the West Wing of the Central Government Offices

The subject was discussed at the meetings of the Panel on 27 April and 26 October 2010. A public hearing on the issue was held by the Panel on 23 November 2010. The public consultation on the proposed redevelopment of the West Wing of the Central Government Offices ended on 31 December 2010. The Administration will update the Panel on the way forward for the proposed scheme.

6. Proposed amendments to Building (Standards of Sanitary Fitments, Plumbing, Drainage Works and Latrines) Regulations

4th Quarter 2011 The Administration intends to introduce to members the proposed amendments to the Building of Sanitary Fitments, Plumbing. (Standards Drainage Works and Latrines) Regulations. including the provision of female sanitary facilities. The Administration intends to submit the subsidiary legislation in due course.

7. North East New Territories New Development Areas Planning and Engineering Study

The subject was proposed by Hon LEE Wing-tat. 4th Quarter 2011 He expressed concern about the proposed comprehensive development and nature conservation enhancement area in the Kwu Tung North New Development Area Preliminary Outline Development Plan.

The Panel discussed the subject of "Planning and Engineering Study on North East New Territories New Development Areas (NENT NDAs) (Stage One Public Engagement)" at the meeting on 25 November 2008. The Administration briefed the Panel on the Preliminary Outline Development Plans in the Stage Two Public Engagement at the meeting on 24 November 2009.

The Administration provided an update on the NENT NDAs Planning and Engineering Study in its supplementary note on the Planning and Engineering Study on Development of Lok Ma Chau Loop -- Investigation -- Stage One Public Engagement (LC Paper No. CB(1)735/10-11(04)) in December 2010.

8. Environmentally Friendly Linkage System for the Kai Tak Development

The Administration intends to brief the Panel on the 4th Quarter 2011 findings of the feasibility study on the above system.

9. Seismic effects on buildings in Hong Kong

The Administration intends to introduce to 4th Quarter 2011 members the recommendations of the Buildings Department's consultancy study on seismic effects on buildings in Hong Kong and the proposed way forward. The Administration intends to submit the subsidiary legislation in due course.

10. Leakage problem of water mains in housing estates

The subject was proposed by Hon WONG Kwok-hing in a letter to the Chairman dated 18 November 2010 (LC Paper No. CB(1)514/10-11(01)). The proposal was discussed at the meeting of the Panel on 23 November 2010 and supported. The Audit Commission has conducted a review to examine the Water Supplies Department's management of burst and leaks in the water supply and distribution systems and published its recommendations in Report No. 55 of the Director of Audit's Report (tabled Legislative in the Council on 17 November 2010).

Note: The Administration intends to provide an information paper on the subject in June 2011.

11. Review of the functions of the Town Planning Board and related issues

At the meeting with Legislative Council Members on 29 November 2005, Heung Yee Kuk Councillors raised concern about the mechanism to check and balance the powers of the Town Planning Board. The relevant extract from the minutes of the meeting was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)700/05-06 on 13 January 2006.

At the Panel meeting on 14 October 2008, Hon Tanya CHAN, Hon Cyd HO and Hon Abraham SHEK expressed views that issues related to the review of the functions of the Town Planning Board, town planning procedures, and To be decided (Note)

secretariat support for the Town Planning Board should be discussed.

Note: The Administration has advised that review of the Town Planning Ordinance is not a priority of the Development Bureau and thus has not been factored into its current work plan.

12. Small House Policy

The subject was proposed by Hon CHAN Kam-lam at the meeting on 11 October 2007. A letter from the Chief Secretary for Administration in reply to the Public Accounts Committee (LC Paper No. CB(1)130/07-08(01)) providing information about the progress of the Small House Policy review was circulated to members on 25 October 2007.

At the meeting with Legislative Council Members on 8 January 2009, Heung Yee Kuk Councillors raised concern about the arrangements regarding Small House applications by descendents of indigenous villagers after village removal. The relevant documents (LC Paper No. CB(1)935/08-09(02)) were circulated to members on 2 March 2009.

Note: The Administration has advised that more time is required for its internal deliberation on the subject and thus it would not be ready to discuss the subject in the near future.
