Opinion Survey on Hong Kong's potential bid to host the 2023 Asian Games

Opinion Survey on Hong Kong's potential bid to host the 2023 Asian Games

November 19 to December 1, 2010

The survey was commissioned by Home Affairs Bureau.

Executive Summary

- 1. This telephone survey was conducted from 19 November to 1 December 2010. In the survey, 1,848 Hong Kong residents aged 18 or above were successfully interviewed by using random sampling, yielding a response rate of 47.9% and a sampling error of around ±2.28% (at a confidence level of 95%).
- 2. The residents being interviewed were first asked about their attitudes towards Hong Kong's bid for the 2023 Asian Games (the order of questions were randomly displayed). According to the survey results, 58.3% of the respondents agreed that hosting the Asian Games "will promote the development of sports in Hong Kong" and 54.6% that it "will bring about direct and indirect economic benefits to Hong Kong. As the same time, a larger percentage of the respondents agreed that "hosting the Asian Games requires a sizeable financial commitment, thus affecting other government projects and services" (65.0%), while more respondents were also worried that "there will be a waste of infrastructure in the Post-Asian Games period" (64.2%). However, there were conflicting views on whether staging the Asian Games can enhance civic pride and contribute to social cohesion. While 46.6 % of respondents agreed with this notion, 50.0% did not.
- 3. When the respondents were asked whether Hong Kong has the ability to organize a successful Asian Games, a larger percentage of them gave positive answers (56.2%), while 37.1% expressed the opposite opinion.
- 4. Regarding the financial arrangement, more than half of the respondents (51.3%) said that it was unacceptable if the total direct cost to Hong Kong of hosting the 2023 Asian Games was not higher than HK\$ 14.5 billion. However, if a more economical plan could be found that would reduce the total direct cost to HK\$ 6 billion without particularly upgrading sport centres, the percentage of those who found this unacceptable dropped to 37.6, while the percentage of those who considered the plan acceptable rose to 54.0.
- 5. After taking into consideration the possibility of reducing the total direct expenditure to 6 billion and other pros and cons, about 46.3% of the respondents supported Hong Kong's bid to stage the 2023 Asian Games ("strongly agree": 6.5% and "agree": 39.8%), while the other 48.9% held the opposite view ("strongly do not support": 11.7% and "do not support": 37.2%). Although the percentage of those expressing disapproval was higher than that of those expressing support, the difference between them was only 2.6%. Taking sampling errors (around ±2.28%) into account, the actual figures for these two groups were rather close. The survey also found that the percentage of those expressing disapproval was explicitly higher in

the earlier stage of the fieldwork (19 November to 25 November—support: 44.3%; do not support: 50.8%), while the percentage of those expressing support gradually increased in the later stage (26 November to 1 December 2010—support: 48.2%, do not support: 47.2%), causing the gap between the two groups to finally narrow.

- 6. In addition, when those respondents who did not support Hong Kong's bid for the 2023 Asian Games were asked the reasons for their opposition (under without default answer options, the respondents were allowed to answer freely and to provide more than one reason), the responses were quite diverse. The reasons mentioned most often were that "public funds should be used in a better way (e.g., the money should be used to help the poor or to subsidize the athletes)" (30.1%) and "the expenditures will be too high" (29.7%).
- 7. To conclude, the number of residents who did not support Hong Kong's bid for the Asian Games was slightly higher than the number that did support it. However, the percentage of those expressing support gradually increased to the point where there was little difference in percentage between support and disapproval. Citizens have conflicting views on this issue and so far no consensus has been reached. Taking into consideration the pros and cons of staging the Asian Games, the ability of Hong Kong to host the Games, the level of acceptance of the financial arrangements for the Games, and the various reasons for objecting to the bid, it was observed that the public still had reservations about Hong Kong's bid to host the 2023 Asian Games. The financial factor was, of course, one of the major reasons for this, but non-financial considerations should also not be ignored and need to be further studied.
