



Hong Kong Housing Authority's (HA's) Commitment

- To produce average 15,000 flats annually, hence the HA procures a considerable amount of construction services and products.
- To strive to drive quality assurance throughout the entire supply chain. Instead of solely replying on the test certificates provided by the suppliers and/or surveillance checks upon material delivery to sites, HA initiates to launch product certification.




What is Product Certification?

It's an upstream control of supply chain

Product Certification is the process whereby a product is certified to have achieved prescribed standards and quality requirements, through regular factory surveillance and periodic random sampling and testing of products by third party of accredited certification body.

Its Function in Quality Assurance Regime





Benefits of Product Certification

- Product Certification Mark to enhance product reliability as well as manufacturer's capability
- Protecting the interest of consumers and procuring entities for the benefit of society as a whole
- Added confidence and assurance on product quality
- Promoting industrial quality through upstream control of the supply chain



"Tested in Hong Kong; Certified in Hong Kong"

- Testing and Certification Services is one of the six pillar industries propelling Hong Kong towards a knowledge based economy.
- Hong Kong Council for Testing and Certification (HKCTC) appointed in Sept 2009 to formulate market-oriented development plan for testing and certification industry
- Four trades selected in the development plan
 - 1. Chinese Medicine
 - 2. Construction Materials
 - 3. Food
 - 4. Jewellery



HA's Earliest Product Certification

Quality Scheme for the Production and Supply of Concrete (QSPSC)

- Jointly developed by the HA and the Hong Kong Quality Assurance Agency (HKQAA) in 1991 for ready mix concrete
- Subsequently specified in HA's contracts on top of in-situ quality control and testing regime
- QSPSC was later widely accepted by the industry and became a policy requirement by Development Bureau for all public works, and a regulatory requirement by Buildings Department for private sector's construction projects

Promoting quality assurance through upstream control, HA is in Support of Product Certification


