

DTT Network Rollout

- 8 new fill-in stations were launched early this year
- Coverage is expanded from 85% of the population last year to currently 89% (i.e., about 6.2 million people, up by 300,000 as compared with 5.9 million people at end 2009)







DTT Network Rollout


- Build 9 more fill-in stations by end 2011
- Ultimate coverage will be on a par with that of existing analogue coverage
- Will study how to improve the TV reception in those remote areas currently suffering from unsatisfactory analogue TV reception





Coverage and Reception Database

- OFTA has updated its on-line database with information about coverage and building readiness for DTT reception
- Facilitate graphical search by clicking a location on the map
- By mid-December 2010, more than 500 000 visits with over 2.2 million searches recorded








Public Response

- DTT is well recognised and accepted by the public. Take-up rate keeps growing at a steady pace.
- About 61% families (around 1.4 million households) are receiving DTT
 (according to a public survey conducted in September 2010)

DTT Receivers

- As of mid-December 2010, 199 models are authorised to use the "higher-tier" label
 - 60 are set-top boxes
 - 139 are integrated digital TV sets



- Set-top Box
 - Average price keeps falling and is currently around \$700~\$800
 - Mostly used as a personal video recorder (PVR)
- Integrated digital TV (iDTV) sets
 - Over 90% flat panel TV sold in the retail market are iDTV
 - Average price drops by more than 10% as compared with that of last year
