The Administration advised that P4 sampans were licensed as Class III type (d) local fishing vessels (i.e. outboard open sampans) under the Merchant Shipping (Local Vessels) (Certification and Licensing Regulation (Cap. 548D) to be used exclusively for fishing and related purposes and P4 sampans were considered as a kind of local fishing vessel. Mr WONG Yung-kan's view that the Administration should - (a) explain clearly to local fishermen the differences in licence requirements and restrictions on the scope of activities in respect of P4 sampans and C7 fishing vessels; (b) appeal to tourists on board pleasure vessels not to capture small fish of certain species and sizes in order to better protect the marine and fisheries resources; (c) consider the need to amend Schedule 2 to the Bill with a view to regulating fishing during diving; and (d) provide training for divers on proper fishing practices and enhance public education on protection of marine and fisheries resources. The Administration was mindful that trawler owners would require a longer time to make a decision on whether they would switch to non-trawling operation in Hong Kong waters and therefore existing owners would be issued with a certificate of eligibility for registration of converted or newly purchased non-trawlers; and	
		(b) a specific registration period for trawler owners would be determined after consultation with the trade, and the registration period would be promulgated by administrative means.	
		Mr TAM Yiu-chung agreed to stipulate the registration period for trawlers by administrative means.
