#### I. Election of Chairman

  - (a) the onus of proof in cases of prosecution against a candidate where the support in election advertisements ("EAs") provided by the supporters themselves was made out of their own volition:
  - (b) whether prior written consent of support had to be obtained from those persons appeared in photos published in a candidate's EAs which mentioned and displayed past activities organized by the candidate involving participation of members of the public;
  - (c) in respect of the proposed central portal maintained by the Registration and Electoral Office, the specifications of the information system for supporting the portal (including the

size of files allowed and time taken for uploading, and user capacity), both the hardware and the manpower resources required for the management and maintenance of the portal site; and

(d) whether the Administration would consider adopting decentralized counting arrangements for the District Council (second) functional constituency; if not, the reasons for that; and if the central counting arrangement as presently proposed in the Bill was adopted, the estimated manpower resources and time required for the completion of the entire vote counting process.
