First Reading

Buildings Legislation (Amendment) Bill 2011

The Bill was read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading under Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Buildings Legislation (Amendment) Bill 2011

The Secretary for Development moved the Second Reading and spoke on the Bill.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President's Deputy stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Inland Revenue (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2011

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which was moved on 9 March 2011 resumed.

Hon Paul CHAN, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Inland Revenue (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2011, addressed the Council on the Committee's Report. After the address, he spoke on the Bill in his personal capacity as a Member.

Two Members and Hon Jeffrey LAM spoke on the Bill.

At 4:27 pm, while Hon Jeffrey LAM was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a committee of the whole Council.

Committee stage

The Council went into committee and considered the Inland Revenue (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2011.

Question that clauses 1 to 4 and 7 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 5, 6, 8 and 9 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved amendments to clauses 5, 6, 8 and 9 and spoke on the amendments.

Question on the amendments moved by the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 5, 6, 8 and 9 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury reported that

the Inland Revenue (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2011

had passed through the Committee stage with amendments. The Bill was ordered to be set down for Third Reading under Rule 59 of the Rules of Procedure.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Pyramid Schemes Prohibition Bill

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which was moved on 1 June 2011 resumed.

Hon Fred LI, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Pyramid Schemes Prohibition Bill, addressed the Council on the Committee's Report. After the address, he spoke on the Bill in his personal capacity as a Member.

Ten Members spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a committee of the whole Council.

Committee stage

The Council went into committee and considered the Pyramid Schemes Prohibition Bill.

Question that clauses 2, 3 and 5 to 9 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 1 and 4 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development moved amendments to clauses 1 and 4 and spoke on the amendments.

Question on the amendments moved by the Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 1 and 4 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

the Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development reported that

the Pyramid Schemes Prohibition Bill

had passed through the Committee stage with amendments. The Bill was ordered to be set down for Third Reading under Rule 59 of the Rules of Procedure.

The Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Members' Motions

Reforming governance philosophy, resolving deep-rooted conflicts in society and alleviating the disparity between the rich and the poor

Hon Frederick FUNG declared that he was actively preparing to run in the coming Chief Executive Election. He then moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That, given that the worsening of deep-rooted conflicts in society, the persistently low popularity of the Government and the numerous blunders in policy implementation all highlight that the existing political system and even social and economic policies, etc. lag far behind the prevailing circumstances, and there is a huge gap between the authorities' governance philosophy and people's expectations; and as a change of government is approaching and the Chief Executive Election is near, this Council urges all social sectors to abandon partisan or political biases, explore in depth and rationally the success, failure, gains and losses of past government policy implementation, reposition the roles and functions of the new government in the future, reform governance philosophy, establish a set of principles of development for all people that give consideration to all social strata, formulate comprehensive and fair social and economic policies, and set up a democratic and open political system, with a view to completely resolving deep-rooted conflicts in society, alleviating the

disparity between the rich and the poor, and building a truly stable, harmonious and just society.

While Hon Frederick FUNG was speaking, the President left the chair at 6:54 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Miriam LAU, took the chair.

Question on Hon Frederick FUNG's motion proposed.

The President's Deputy stated that three Members intended to move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the three amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon IP Kwok-him, Hon Audrey EU and Hon Albert CHAN, who intended to move amendments, spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The Secretary for Labour and Welfare as well as the Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Six Members and Dr Hon Samson TAM spoke on the motion and the amendments.

At 8:25 pm, while Dr Hon Samson TAM was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Eleven other Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Frederick FUNG spoke on the amendments.

The President suspended the meeting at 9:54 pm.

The Council resumed at 9:00 am on 8 December 2011.

A Member spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Labour and Welfare as well as the Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs spoke again.

Hon IP Kwok-him moved the following amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion:

To delete "given that" after "That," and substitute with "as lessons drawn from experience show that"; to add "Hong Kong" after "of deep-rooted conflicts in"; to add "and" after "future,"; to add "including: (a) regarding people's livelihood, to enhance the Government's roles and functions, make planning as soon as possible and expeditiously deal with the problems during development, and strive to enable every member of the public to enjoy the opportunities and fruit of development; (b) regarding the economy, to adopt a long-term vision and proactive initiatives to organically link the development strategy of Hong Kong with that of our country, and continuously strengthen Hong Kong's connection with Asia and the international community; and (c) regarding governance, to examine in-depth the relationship between democracy and good governance, and promote democracy in an orderly manner while creating conditions for good governance, so as to" after "reform governance philosophy,"; to delete "principles of development for all people that give consideration to all social strata, formulate" after "a set of"; to delete ", and" after "fair social and economic policies" and substitute with "that give consideration to the development of all social strata,"; to delete "with a view to completely resolving" after "open political system," and substitute with "resolve"; to delete "alleviating" after "conflicts in society," and substitute with "alleviate"; and to delete "building" after "the poor, and" and substitute with "build".

Question on Hon IP Kwok-him's amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion proposed and put.

Hon Frederick FUNG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 17 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendment, one against it and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 18 were present, seven were in favour of the amendment, nine against it and one abstained (voting record in **Appendix I**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the amendment was negatived.

The President stated that Hon Audrey EU had withdrawn her amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion.

Hon Albert CHAN moved the following amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion:

To add "for returning the Chief Executive and all seats of the Legislative Council by universal suffrage in 2012" after "open political system".

Question on Hon Albert CHAN's amendment to Hon Frederick FUNG's motion proposed and put.

Hon Albert CHAN claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 18 were present, three were in favour of the amendment, 14 against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 19 were present, 10 were in favour of the amendment, seven against it and one abstained (voting record in **Appendix II**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Miriam LAU rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions in relation to the motion on "Reforming governance philosophy, resolving deep-rooted conflicts in society and alleviating the disparity between the rich and the poor" or amendments thereto, the Council do proceed to each of such divisions after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon Frederick FUNG replied.

Question on Hon Frederick FUNG's motion put.

Hon IP Kwok-him claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

Hon Cyd HO stated that she had pressed the wrong button; her intent was to vote in favour of the motion. The President ordered that the voting record be amended accordingly.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 19 were present, 12 were in favour of the motion and seven abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 19 were present, 14 were in favour of the motion and four abstained (voting record in **Appendix III**). Since the question was agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the motion was passed.

Motion for the adjournment of the Council

Hon James TO moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That this Council do now adjourn for the purpose of debating the following issue: the fire tragedy at Fa Yuen Street in Mong Kok and ways to improve street environment and fire safety of buildings for the purposes of avoiding the recurrence of similar incidents and safeguarding the lives and properties of the public.

Question on Hon James TO's motion proposed.

Thirteen Members and Hon Cyd HO spoke on the motion.

While Hon Cyd HO was speaking, the President left the chair at 10:55 am temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Fred LI, took the chair.

Eight other Members spoke on the motion.

The Secretary for Food and Health replied.

At 11:40 am, while the Secretary for Food and Health was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

The Secretary for Development replied.

The President stated that as the debate on the motion had exceeded one and a half hours, in accordance with Rule 16(7) of the Rules of Procedure, the motion shall not be put to vote.

Next meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 14 December 2011 at 11:00 am.

The Council was adjourned at 11:56 am.
