Bills

First Reading

Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2011

The Bill was read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading under Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill 2011

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the Second Reading and spoke on the Bill.

At 1:22 pm, while the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

General Holidays and Employment Legislation (Substitution of Holidays) (Amendment) Bill 2011

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which was moved on 23 November 2011 resumed.

Ten Members spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Labour and Welfare replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a committee of the whole Council.

Committee stage

The Council went into committee and considered the General Holidays and Employment Legislation (Substitution of Holidays) (Amendment) Bill 2011.

Question that clauses 1 to 5 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Labour and Welfare reported that

the General Holidays and Employment Legislation (Substitution of Holidays) (Amendment) Bill 2011

had passed through the Committee stage without amendments. The Bill was ordered to be set down for Third Reading under Rule 59 of the Rules of Procedure.

The Secretary for Labour and Welfare moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2011

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which was moved on 25 May 2011 resumed.

Hon Miriam LAU, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2011, addressed the Council on the Committee's Report. After the address, she spoke on the Bill in her personal capacity as a Member.

Ten Members spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a committee of the whole Council.

Committee stage

The Council went into committee and considered the Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2011.

Question that clauses 1, 2, 3, 13 and 15 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 4 to 10, 14, 16, 17, 18 and 20 to 26 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Chairman stated that Hon Andrew CHENG had given notice to move amendments to clauses 4 to 8, 14, 16, 17, 18 and 20 to 26. The Secretary for Transport and Housing had also given notice to move amendments to clauses 4 to 10, 14, 16, 17, 18 and 20 to 26. In addition, Hon KAM Nai-wai had given notice to move amendments to clause 14. The committee would first put to vote Hon Andrew CHENG's amendments to clauses 5(1), 6(2), 6(3), 6(4A), 6(5), 6(7) and 6(9). If Hon Andrew CHENG's amendments were passed, the Secretary might not move the amendments to clauses 5(1), 6(3) and 6(9), but might move the amendments to clauses 4, 5(2), 6(10), 7, 8, 14, 16(1), 16(9), 17, 18 and 20 to 26. If Hon Andrew CHENG's amendments were negatived, the Secretary might move the amendments to clauses 4 to 8, 14, 16(1), 16(9), 17, 18 and 20 to 26.

The Chairman further stated that whether Hon KAM Nai-wai might move his amendments would depend on whether the amendments moved by the Secretary for Transport and Housing and Hon Andrew CHENG were passed or not. If the Secretary's amendments were passed (irrespective of whether or not Hon Andrew CHENG's earlier amendments to clauses 5 and 6 were passed), Hon KAM Nai-wai might move his amendments to further amend clause 14. If the Secretary's amendments were negatived, and Hon Andrew CHENG's amendments to clauses 4 to 8, 14, 16, 17, 18 and 20 to 26 were passed (irrespective of whether or not his earlier amendments to clauses 5 and 6 were passed), Hon KAM Nai-wai might not move his amendments; but if Hon Andrew CHENG's amendments were negatived, Hon KAM Nai-wai

would withdraw his amendments. The Chairman added that after the aforesaid amendments had been dealt with, irrespective of whether or not the various amendments were passed, the Secretary for Transport and Housing might move the amendments to clauses 9, 10 and 16(2).

The Chairman then ordered a joint debate on the original provisions and the amendments proposed by Hon Andrew CHENG, the Secretary for Transport and Housing and Hon KAM Nai-wai.

Hon Andrew CHENG moved the amendments to clauses 5(1), 6(2), 6(3), 6(4A), 6(5), 6(7) and 6(9), and spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing spoke on the original provisions and the amendments.

Hon KAM Nai-wai spoke on the amendments.

Two Members spoke on the amendments.

Hon KAM Nai-wai spoke again.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing spoke again.

Hon Andrew CHENG spoke again.

Question on the amendments put.

Hon Andrew CHENG claimed a division. The Chairman then ordered the committee to proceed a division.

The Chairman announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 26 were present, four were in favour of the amendments and 22 against them; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 26 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendments, nine against them and two abstained (voting record in **Appendix I**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the amendments were negatived.

Hon Miriam LAU rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions in relation to other provisions of the Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2011 or amendments thereto, the committee do proceed to each of such divisions after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing moved the amendments to clauses 4 to 8, 14, 16(1), 16(9), 17, 18 and 20 to 26.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

The Chairman stated as the Secretary for Transport and Housing's amendments had been passed by the committee, Hon Andrew CHENG might not move his remaining amendments.

Question that clauses 4 to 8, 17, 18 and 20 to 26 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon KAM Nai-wai moved further amendments to clause 14.

Question on the amendments put.

Hon KAM Nai-wai claimed a division. The Chairman then ordered the committee to proceed to a division under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The Chairman announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 26 were present, four were in favour of the amendments, 20 against them and two abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 26 were present, 14 were in favour of the amendments, seven against them and four abstained (voting record in **Appendix II**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the amendments were negatived.

Question that clause 14 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing moved the amendments to clauses 9, 10 and 16(2).

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 9, 10 and 16 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 11, 12 and 19 stand part of the Bill proposed.

New clause 14A read the first time.

The Chairman stated that the Secretary for Transport and Housing had given notice to move amendments to clauses 11, 12 and 19, and to add new clause 14A to the Bill.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing moved the amendments to clauses 11, 12 and 19, and the addition of new clause 14A to the Bill. She then spoke on the amendments and the new clause.

Question on the amendments proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 11, 12 and 19 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing moved the Second Reading of new clause 14A.

Question on the Second Reading of new clause 14A proposed, put and agreed to.

New clause 14A read the second time.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing moved the addition of new clause 14A to the Bill.

Question on the addition proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Transport and Housing reported that

the Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill 2011

had passed through the Committee stage with amendments. The Bill was ordered to be set down for Third Reading under Rule 59 of the Rules of Procedure.

The Secretary for Transport and Housing moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed and put.

Hon Miriam LAU claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that there were 49 Members present, 47 were in favour of the motion and one abstained (voting record in **Appendix III**). Since the question was agreed by a majority of the Members present, he declared that the motion was passed.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Proposed resolution under section 34(2) of the Interpretation and General</u> Clauses Ordinance

Hon Miriam LAU drew the President's attention to the absence of the public officer attending this item. The President suspended the meeting at 7:07:17 pm.

The Council resumed at 7:07:46 pm.

Hon James TO moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

Resolved that the Companies Ordinance (Exemption of Companies and Prospectuses from Compliance with Provisions) (Amendment) Notice 2011, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 143 of 2011 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 26 October 2011, be repealed.

Question on the motion proposed.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury spoke on the motion.

Hon WONG Ting-kwong spoke on the motion.

While Hon WONG Ting-kwong was speaking, the President left the chair at 7:33 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Miriam LAU, took the chair.

Two other Members spoke on the motion.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury spoke again.

Hon James TO replied.

Question on the motion put.

Hon James TO claimed a division. The President's Deputy then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

At 8:30 pm, while the division bell was ringing, the President resumed the chair.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 21 were present, four were in favour of the motion, 16 against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 25 were present, 12 were in favour of the motion and 12 against it (voting record in **Appendix IV**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the motion was negatived.

Capitalizing on the opportunity presented by the building of a cruise terminal to develop Kowloon East into a business and tourism district

Hon Paul TSE moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That this Council urges the Government to capitalize on the opportunity presented by the building of a cruise terminal by consolidating the existing tourism infrastructure and facilities and building new ones, while implementing the plan of Energizing Kowloon East, with a view to developing Kowloon East into an important business and tourism district.

Question on Hon Paul TSE's motion proposed.

The President stated that four Members would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the four amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon CHAN Kam-lam, Hon Alan LEONG, Hon WONG Kwok-kin and Hon Fred LI, who would move amendments, spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The Secretary for Development spoke on the motion and the amendments.

A Member spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The President suspended the meeting at 10:05 pm.

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The Council resumed at 9:00 am on 15 December 2011.

Four Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Paul TSE spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Development spoke again.

Hon CHAN Kam-lam moved the following amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion:

To add "the plan of Energizing Kowloon East announced by the Chief Executive in the Policy Address this year will inject fresh economic impetus and create employment opportunities for the entire Kowloon; in this connection," after "That"; to delete "by consolidating" after "a cruise terminal" and substitute with "and the development of Kai Tak new area, expeditiously finalize an environmentally friendly linkage system and its extension to To Kwa Wan, enhance the designs of the Metro Park and the Longjin Bridge conservation zone, construct a new Kowloon harbourfront promenade stretching from Lei Yue Mun to Sham Shui Po, enhance the uses of typhoon shelters, introduce leisure water sports facilities, and improve the transport network of Kowloon; and, to consolidate"; to delete "building" after "and facilities and" and substitute with "build"; and to add "core" after "an important".

Question on Hon CHAN Kam-lam's amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

As Hon CHAN Kam-lam's amendment had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon Alan LEONG to revise the terms of his amendment.

Hon Alan LEONG moved the following further amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam:

To add "; this Council also urges the Government to: (a) when establishing a Kowloon East Development Office responsible for steering and monitoring this strategic development project, follow the same approach of holding discussions with the public adopted in the planning for the Kai Tak Development Area, so as to enable people, especially those from Kowloon East, to fully participate in the discussions and put forward views on the alignment, station locations and fares of an environmentally friendly elevated monorail system, as well as the layout of public open spaces, the construction of footbridges, and the designs of waterfront promenades, etc.; (b) expeditiously complete and announce the financial report and feasibility study on the monorail system, and study the sustainable development of monorail operation; (c) improve the linkage of the existing transport network of Kowloon East with those of the various districts in Hong Kong, and ensure that the new developments will not cause any traffic congestion and obstruct local district residents commuting to and from work and travelling to and from the district; and (d) expedite the relocation of government office buildings in Wan Chai to the district, so as to stimulate economic activities in the district and create employment opportunities" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon Alan LEONG's amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam proposed, put and agreed to.

As Hon CHAN Kam-lam's and Hon Alan LEONG's amendments had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon WONG Kwok-kin to revise the terms of his amendment.

Hon WONG Kwok-kin moved the following further amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam and Hon Alan LEONG:

To add "; (e) review the road transport network of the various areas of Kowloon East, project whether the traffic loads of the existing road networks in the various communities are adequate for dovetailing with the future development of the district, and expeditiously implement improvement works in accordance with the review outcomes and development needs; (f) study the linkage of the new and old areas in Kowloon East by an environmentally friendly mass transit system, and improve the public transport supporting facilities connecting Kowloon East to other districts, so as to cope with the needs of tourists and businesses in the future; (g) perfect the pedestrian linking systems and

barrier-free facilities in the new and old areas of Kowloon East, so that tourists and residents can travel between new and old development areas smoothly and without obstruction; (h) expeditiously finalize the construction of a general hospital in Kai Tak and expedite the expansion of the United Christian Hospital, so as to meet the medical needs arising from the population growth and development of Kowloon East in the future; (i) study the construction of cycle tracks along the harbourfront of Kowloon East and various other districts for linkage with the cycle track to be constructed in the Kai Tak New Development Area, so as to develop a network of urban cycle tracks; (j) make use of the advantages of Kowloon East, such as cultural monuments and existing developing etc., for a special heritage trail environmentalism, historical monuments, local culture and tourism, so as to add special features to the district; (k) increase the space for greening and public art in Kowloon East, and introduce bazaars with local characteristics, such as temple fairs, so as to attract tourists and create employment opportunities; and (1) use the site of the former Tai Hom Village and San Po Kong Industrial Area, etc., for developing cultural and creative industries, so as to build the district into a tourism spot related to the Hong Kong film industry" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon WONG Kwok-kin's amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam and Hon Alan LEONG proposed, put and agreed to.

As the amendments of Hon CHAN Kam-lam, Hon Alan LEONG and Hon WONG Kwok-kin had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon Fred LI to revise the terms of his amendment.

Hon Fred LI moved the following further amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam, Hon Alan LEONG and Hon WONG Kwok-kin:

To add "; and (m) construct a network of designated cycle tracks in Kowloon East for internal and external connection, strengthen green transport as a feature of the district and upgrade bay water quality standards for enjoyment by the public and tourists, promote diversified local development and provide Hong Kong people with an appropriate urban residential area" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon Fred LI's amendment to Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam, Hon Alan LEONG and Hon WONG Kwok-kin proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon Paul TSE replied.

Question on Hon Paul TSE's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kam-lam, Hon Alan LEONG, Hon WONG Kwok-kin and Hon Fred LI put and agreed to.

Alleviating the difficulties of small and medium enterprises in taking out insurance

Hon Tommy CHEUNG moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That, given that in recent years, many retail consumption and business services industries in Hong Kong, when taking out employees' compensation insurance and motor vehicle third party risk insurance as required by the law, often encountered significant premium increases or even refusal of underwriting insurance policy by insurance companies on various pretexts, causing the employers of many small and medium enterprises great anxiety and significant increases in costs, this Council urges the Government to proactively discuss with the insurance sector to make efforts to reduce the costs and difficulties of various industries in taking out the relevant insurance, so as to avoid affecting their business operation and effective protection for employees; the relevant measures should include:

- (a) to enhance the Employees' Compensation Insurance Residual Scheme by, in addition to the existing list of 19 high-risk occupations, including those occupations such as retail consumption and business services, which are of lower-risk but have practical difficulties in taking out employees' compensation insurance, and to set relevant premium benchmark rates to serve as market reference indicators, so as to provide support as the last resort to enterprises in need of insurance coverage;
- (b) to require the police to rigorously combat illegal acts such as champerty and conspiracy to make fraudulent insurance claims, etc.; and
- (c) to increase the transparency of matters such as pricing, operation, risk assessment and complaint handling, etc. of the insurer sector, and strengthen the efforts of the Government, various industries, the media and the public in monitoring insurance companies, so as to prevent law-abiding employers from bearing unnecessary burden.

Question on Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion proposed.

The President stated that three Members would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the three amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon CHAN Kin-por, Hon WONG Kwok-hing and Hon LEE Cheuk-yan, who would move amendments, spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Nine Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Tommy CHEUNG spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury spoke again.

Hon CHAN Kin-por moved the following amendment to Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion:

To delete "given that in recent years" after "That," and substitute with "as recently"; to delete "on various pretexts" after "by insurance companies" and substitute with "for various reasons"; to delete "; and" after "insurance claims, etc." and substitute with ", and to establish a reporting channel for the public and insurance companies to report cases of suspected fraudulent insurance claims; (c) to request the Hospital Authority to combat attempts to make fraudulent insurance claims through obtaining prolonged sick leave certificates by exaggerating clinical conditions and degrees of injuries; (d) to request the Department of Justice to initiate prosecution against civil contempt of court, so as to deter misstatement with the intent of making fraudulent insurance claims; and"; and to delete the original "(c)" and substitute with "(e)".

Question on Hon CHAN Kin-por's amendment to Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

As Hon CHAN Kin-por's amendment had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon WONG Kwok-hing to revise his amendment.

Hon WONG Kwok-hing moved the following further amendment to Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kin-por:

To add "(f) when enhancing the Employees' Compensation Insurance Residual Scheme, to include recycling industry as well" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon WONG Kwok-hing's amendment to Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kin-por proposed, put and agreed to.

As Hon CHAN Kin-por's and Hon WONG Kwok-hing's amendments had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon LEE Cheuk-yan to revise his amendment.

Hon LEE Cheuk-yan moved the following further amendment to Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kin-por and Hon WONG Kwok-hing:

To add "(g) to set up a publicly-operated 'central employees' compensation fund' for lowering administration fees under the privately-operated employees' compensation insurance system, which not only can reduce employers' expenses on taking out insurance, but also provide better protection for employees" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon LEE Cheuk-yan's amendment to Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kin-por and Hon WONG Kwok-hing proposed and put.

Hon CHAN Kin-por claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 13 were present, five were in favour of the amendment, seven against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 17 were present, 15 were in favour of the amendment and one against it (voting record in **Appendix V**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Miriam LAU rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further divisions in relation to the motion on "Alleviating the difficulties of small and medium enterprises in taking out insurance" or amendments thereto, the Council do proceed to each of such divisions after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon Tommy CHEUNG replied.

Question on Hon Tommy CHEUNG's motion as amended by Hon CHAN Kin-por and Hon WONG Kwok-hing put and agreed to.

Next meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 21 December 2011 at 11:00 am.
