<u>Bills</u>

First Reading

Legislative Council (Amendment) Bill 2012 Electoral Legislation (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2012

The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading under Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Legislative Council (Amendment) Bill 2012 Electoral Legislation (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2012

The Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs moved the Second Reading and spoke on the above two Bills respectively.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President's Deputy stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debates on the above Bills were adjourned and the Bills were referred to the House Committee.

Adaptation of Laws (Military References) Bill 2010

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which was moved on 14 July 2010 resumed.

Hon IP Kwok-him, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Adaptation of Laws (Military References) Bill 2010, addressed the Council on the Committee's Report.

At 1:38 pm, while Hon IP Kwok-him was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

After the address, Hon IP Kwok-him spoke on the Bill in his personal capacity as a Member.

Three Members spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Security replied.

Question on the Second Reading put.

Dr Hon Margaret NG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

The President announced that 46 Members were present, 34 were in favour of the motion and 11 against it (voting record in **Appendix I**). Since the question was agreed by a majority of the Members present, he declared that the motion was passed.

Bill read the second time and committed to a committee of the whole Council.

Committee stage

The Council went into committee and considered the Adaptation of Laws (Military References) Bill 2010.

Question that clauses 1 to 4 stand part of the Bill proposed.

A Member spoke on the clauses.

The Secretary for Security replied.

Question that clauses 1 to 4 stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Question that clause 5 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Security moved the deletion of clause 5 and spoke on this amendment.

A Member spoke on the amendment.

Question on the amendment put and agreed to.

The Chairman stated that as the amendment to delete clause 5 had been agreed, clause 5 was therefore deleted from the Bill.

Question that Schedule 2 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that Schedule 1 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Security moved amendments to Schedule 1 and spoke on the amendments.

Three Members spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Security spoke again.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

Question that Schedule 1 as amended stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Security reported that

the Adaptation of Laws (Military References) Bill 2010

had passed through the Committee stage with amendments. The Bill was ordered to be set down for Third Reading under Rule 59 of the Rules of Procedure.

The Secretary for Security moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed and put.

Dr Hon Margaret NG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

The President announced that 47 Members were present, 35 were in favour of the motion, 10 against it and one abstained (voting record in **Appendix II**). Since the question was agreed by a majority of the Members present, he declared that the motion was passed.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Members' Motions

Proposed resolution under section 34(4) of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance

Hon Cyd HO moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

Resolved that in relation to the Places of Public Entertainment (Exemption) (Amendment) Order 2011, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 183 of 2011, and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 11 January 2012, the period for amending subsidiary legislation referred to in section 34(2) of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) be extended under section 34(4) of that Ordinance to the meeting of 29 February 2012.

Question on Hon Cyd HO's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Seeking papers, books, records or documents in relation to the 2012 tariff adjustments by CLP Power Hong Kong Limited and The Hongkong Electric Company Limited

Hon Miriam LAU moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That, since the data and information behind the 2012 tariff adjustments by the two power companies have not been fully disclosed, and the details of their five-year Development Plans approved in 2008 have also not been publicized, the Panel on Economic Development be authorized under section 9(2) of the Legislative Council (Powers and Privileges) Ordinance (Cap. 382) to exercise the powers conferred by section 9(1) of the Ordinance to order the Secretary for the Environment of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region to produce all papers, books, records or documents in relation to the 2012 tariff adjustments by CLP Power Hong Kong Limited and The Hongkong Electric Company Limited respectively, including:

- (a) detailed information on the 2012 tariff adjustments by the two power companies; and
- (b) detailed information on the five-year Development Plans of the two power companies.

Question on Hon Miriam LAU's motion proposed.

The President stated that Hon Vincent FANG would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Vincent FANG moved the following amendment to Hon Miriam LAU's motion and spoke on the motion and the amendment:

To add ", but it must be ensured that the exercise of this power is in the public interest, does not interfere with normal commercial operation, and does not lead to divulging sensitive commercial information" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon Vincent FANG's amendment to Hon Miriam LAU's motion proposed.

The Secretary for the Environment spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Fourteen Members and Hon LEE Wing-tat spoke on the motion and the amendment.

While Hon LEE Wing-tat was speaking, the President left the chair at 7:24 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Miriam LAU, took the chair.

Two other Members and Hon CHAN Kin-por spoke on the motion and the amendment.

At 7:57 pm, while Hon CHAN Kin-por was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

Three more Members spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon Miriam LAU spoke on the amendment.

The Secretary for the Environment spoke again.

Question on Hon Vincent FANG's amendment to Hon Miriam LAU's motion put.

Hon Vincent FANG claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, nine were in favour of the amendment and 16 against it; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 26 were present, 17 were in favour of the amendment and eight against it (voting record in **Appendix III**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the amendment was negatived.

Hon Miriam LAU rose to move the following motion without notice:

That in the event of further division on the motion on "Seeking papers, books, records or documents in relation to the 2012 tariff adjustments by CLP Power Hong Kong Limited and The Hongkong Electric Company Limited", the Council do proceed to each of such divisions after the division bell has been rung for one minute.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon Miriam LAU replied.

Question on Hon Miriam LAU's motion put.

Hon Albert CHAN claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to proceed to a division under Rule 49(5) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that among the Members returned by functional constituencies, 25 were present, six were in favour of the motion, 18 against it and one abstained; while among the Members returned by geographical constituencies through direct elections, 26 were present, 20 were in favour of the motion and five against it (voting record in **Appendix IV**). Since the question was not agreed by a majority of each of the two groups of Members present, he declared that the motion was negatived.

Reviewing the education policy for ethnic minority students

Hon Abraham SHEK moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That, while the Equal Opportunities Commission ('EOC') already published 'Education for all: the Report on the Working Group on Education for Ethnic Minorities' ('the Report') in July 2011, highlighting how the mainstream education system has let down ethnic minority students who are mostly from low-income families and putting forward various recommendations to the Government on addressing their learning needs, the Government has not yet proposed any concrete measures on following up the implementation of the EOC's recommendations in the Report and offered any additional support to the 14 000 ethnic minority students in Hong Kong; in this connection, this Council urges the Government to review its education policy for ethnic minority students, so as to address their concerns, particularly the admission and assessment procedures of schools, the available choices of designated schools and mainstream schools, learning support for pre-primary ethnic minority students and provision of an alternative Chinese Curriculum and Qualification, so that ethnic minority students can enjoy equal access to quality education, which is pivotal not only to such students' pursuit of further education and employment, but also to Hong Kong maintaining its competitiveness.

Question on Hon Abraham SHEK's motion proposed.

The President stated that two Members would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the two amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon Starry LEE, who would move amendments, spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The Secretary for Education spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The President suspended the meeting at 9:54 pm.

The Council resumed at 9:00 am on 9 February 2012.

Two Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Frederick FUNG declared that he was the convenor of the Policy and Research Committee of the Equal Opportunities Commission as well as a member of the Working Group on Education for Ethnic Minorities. He then spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Fourteen other Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Paul TSE declared that he was a member of the Equal Opportunities Commission. He then spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Abraham SHEK spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Education spoke again.

Hon Tanya CHAN moved the following amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion:

To delete "," after "That" and substitute with "education is the key to success and the future of our next generation;"; and to add "; the relevant initiatives should include: (a) implementing a separate Chinese curriculum assessment scheme especially for ethnic minority students to help them meet the requirements of further education and vocational training; (b) providing preprimary educational institutions with additional resources and relevant support to encourage the admission of ethnic minority students; (c) enhancing the training for teachers who teach Chinese as a second or foreign language; (d) designing suitable assessment schemes for adoption by schools to facilitate early identification of ethnic minority students' special needs, so that they can receive appropriate education; (e) launching a study to monitor the learning progress of ethnic minority students to enable the Government to review their needs and the effectiveness of their education, and establishing a database for systemic data collection and analysis, so as to facilitate the formulation of an education policy and the provision of support which meet the needs of ethnic minority students; (f) increasing intake quotas, providing a positive learning environment and adequate support to meet the demand of ethnic minority students with special educational needs; (g) enhancing the career guidance and vocational training services for ethnic minority graduates; and (h) enhancing public awareness of the importance of cultural diversities and ethnic integration, so as to create a better learning environment for ethnic minority students" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon Tanya CHAN's amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

As Hon Tanya CHAN's amendment had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon Starry LEE to revise the terms of her amendment.

Hon Starry LEE moved the following further amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion as amended by Hon Tanya CHAN:

To add "; and (i) developing teaching materials and providing parental education" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon Starry LEE's amendment to Hon Abraham SHEK's motion as amended by Hon Tanya CHAN proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon Abraham SHEK replied.

Question on Hon Abraham SHEK's motion as amended by Hon Tanya CHAN and Hon Starry LEE put and agreed to.

Formulating an industrial policy

Hon Andrew LEUNG moved the following motion and spoke on the motion:

That this Council urges the SAR Government to formulate a comprehensive policy to promote high value-adding, new technology-intensive and innovative industries, so as to ensure Hong Kong's long-term economic development.

Question on Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion proposed.

The President stated that two Members would move amendments to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the two amendments would be debated together in a joint debate.

Hon IP Wai-ming and Hon Ronny TONG, who would move amendments, spoke on the motion and the amendments.

The Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Fifteen Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Andrew LEUNG spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development spoke again.

Hon IP Wai-ming moved the following amendment to Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion:

To add ", since the nineties of the last century, the massive northward relocation of factories created a structural problem of industrial imbalance in Hong Kong and large numbers of grass-roots and skilled workers became unemployed or underemployed due to industrial shrinkage, the unhealthy phenomenon of society relying solely on a handful of industries to support its economy has progressively emerged; in order to ease the problem concerned and develop industrial diversification," after "That"; to add "as well as industries capable of sustainable development and creating massive employment opportunities, and at the same time, re-design the relevant manpower training, including reviewing the Apprenticeship Ordinance and extending the relevant system to various emerging industries, as well as providing land and financial facilitation and support to emerging industries" after "innovative industries"; and to add "and different employment opportunities for local workers" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon IP Wai-ming's amendment to Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion proposed, put and agreed to.

As Hon IP Wai-ming's amendment had been passed, the President granted leave for Hon Ronny TONG to revise the terms of his amendment.

Hon Ronny TONG moved the following further amendment to Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion as amended by Hon IP Wai-ming, and explained the revised terms of his amendment to the Council:

To add "; besides, this Council also urges the SAR Government to create a favourable environment conducive to setting up businesses, promote better employment relationship, and expeditiously study setting standard working hours and standardizing the number of general holidays for the relevant trades" immediately before the full stop.

Question on Hon Ronny TONG's amendment to Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion as amended by Hon IP Wai-ming proposed, put and agreed to.

Hon Andrew LEUNG replied.

Question on Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion as amended by Hon IP Wai-ming and Hon Ronny TONG put and agreed to.

Next meeting

The President declared that the next meeting of the Council would be held on 15 February 2012 at 11:00 am.
