Reply:

Over the years, we have developed good working relations with the Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Office of the State Council (HKMAO) and the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (OCMFA) in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) in accordance with the principle of "One Country, Two Systems" and the relevant provisions of the Basic Law. We maintain close contacts and communication on matters of mutual concern, such as the work of the HKSAR in support of reconstruction in the Sichuan earthquake stricken areas, the HKSAR's participation in the Shanghai Expo 2010, the HKSAR's work in complementing the National Five-year Plan, cooperation arrangements with various regions in the Mainland, and official exchanges and visits between Hong Kong and the Mainland; and Hong Kong's participation in external affairs including international conventions, international and regional organisations and conferences, as well as affording consular protection to Hong Kong residents in distress overseas. The ranks of officers involved in such liaison and contacts vary, having regard to the nature of the matters concerned.

Reply:

We have achieved a timetable for universal suffrage and secured the passage of the 2012 constitutional reform package, which significantly enhances the democratic elements of the electoral system. This paves the way for implementing universal suffrage for the Chief Executive ("CE") and the Legislative Council ("LegCo") in 2017 and 2020 respectively. We are fully committed to pursuing democracy for Hong Kong and to attaining universal suffrage for Hong Kong.

2. At this stage, the current-term Government has only been authorised by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress to determine the methods for selecting the CE and for forming the LegCo in 2012. As to how the two electoral methods should be amended for attaining universal suffrage, this is beyond what the current-term Government has been authorised to deal with. In the public consultation conducted from 18 November 2009 to 19 February 2010 on the methods for selecting the CE and for forming the LegCo in 2012, we have also received public views relating to universal suffrage for the CE and the LegCo. We have published the relevant views which will serve as reference for the Government to be formed in 2012 and 2017 for dealing with the issue of universal suffrage for the CE and the LegCo.

Reply:

The Equal Opportunities Commission (EOC) is responsible for the implementation of the four anti-discrimination ordinances, and carries out publicity, promotion and education programmes and enforcement work to promote equal opportunities in these areas. In 2012-13, a subvention of \$90.8 million will be provided to the EOC, representing a net increase of \$2.6 million or 2.9% compared with the revised estimate of 2011-12. The increase includes a provision of \$1.162 million for the EOC to strengthen its manpower to enhance its training and promotion efforts, and \$0.5 million for the EOC to undertake partnership projects as new public engagement initiatives.

2. Although the recent incidents between residents of the Mainland and Hong Kong do not involve racial matters, the EOC has noted these incidents. In its promotion of inclusion and equal opportunities in society, the EOC has repeatedly called for tolerance and rationality in social debates through various channels (including media statements and interviews, radio programme, talks and sharing sessions, and other initiatives), and such efforts would continue. These efforts are part of the EOC's ongoing promotion work and no separate breakdown of provision is available. At present, services for new arrivals from the Mainland and ethnic minorities are provided by different bureaux and departments according to their respective policies. As regards support services to new

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arrivals and ethnic minorities to facilita	te their	integration	into	the c	community,	they	are
provided by the Home Affairs Departm	ent.						

3. The EOC keeps statistics on complaints received and handled in accordance with the relevant anti-discrimination ordinances, and does not have breakdown of complaints concerning relations between residents in Hong Kong and the Mainland.
