# I. Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman

[Appendices V and VI to LC Paper No. CB(2)11/11-12]

#### Election of Chairman

Mr TAM Yiu-chung, the incumbent Chairman, called for nominations for the chairmanship of the Panel on Constitutional Affairs ("the Panel").

Mr TAM Yiu-chung was nominated by Mr IP Kwok-him and the nomination was seconded by Mr Jeffrey LAM. Mr TAM Yiu-chung accepted the nomination.

- 2. <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u>, the incumbent Deputy Chairman, took over from Mr TAM Yiu-chung to preside over the election. <u>Mrs LEUNG</u> called for other nominations. Mr LEE Wing-tat was nominated by Mr CHIM Pui-chung and the nomination was seconded by Mr Alan LEONG. <u>Mr LEE Wing-tat</u> accepted the nomination.
- 3. <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u> announced that voting be conducted by secret ballot. After all members had cast their votes, <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u> invited Mr IP Kwok-him and Mr CHIM Pui-chung who had nominated the two candidates to monitor the counting of votes.
- 4. <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u> announced that 21 and eight members voted for Mr TAM Yiu-chung and Mr LEE Wing-tat respectively. <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u> declared Mr TAM Yiu-chung elected as the Chairman of the Panel for the 2011-2012 session. <u>Mr TAM</u> then took the chair.

### Election of Deputy Chairman

- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> called for nominations for the deputy chairmanship of the Panel. Mrs Sophie LEUNG was nominated by Mr IP Kwok-him and the nomination was seconded by Mr WONG Yung-kan and Mr WONG Kwok-kin. <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u> accepted the nomination.
- 6. As there was no other nomination, the Chairman declared Mrs Sophie LEUNG elected as the Deputy Chairman of the Panel for the 2011-2012 session.

# II. Schedule of meetings for the 2011-2012 session

7. <u>Members</u> agreed that as in the last session, future regular meetings of the Panel would be held on the third Monday of each month at 2:30 pm. As regards the duration of regular meetings, <u>Ms Miriam LAU</u> suggested that regular meetings should be shortened from three to two hours in the future and be extended for another hour as appropriate if there were many items on the agenda. <u>Mr IP Kwok-him</u> and <u>Mrs Sophie LEUNG</u> agreed with the suggestion.

- 8. <u>Dr Margaret NG</u>, however, said that given the large membership size of the Panel, members had agreed in the past that regular meetings of the Panel be scheduled for three hours so as to allow sufficient time for discussion. <u>Mr LEE Wing-tat</u> shared a similar view. He considered that as controversial and important issues would be discussed by the Panel, a three-hour meeting would be appropriate.
- 9. <u>The Chairman</u> advised that according to past experience, the duration of some regular meetings of the Panel were less than three hours. He suggested that the duration of future regular meetings of the Panel would be two hours, same as that of other Panels; and in case of a heavy agenda, the duration of the meeting could be extended for another hour. <u>Members</u> agreed.

# III. Items for discussion at the next meeting

10. The Chairman said that the next regular meeting of the Panel would be held on Monday, 17 October 2011 and the Panel was scheduled to receive a briefing from the Administration on the Chief Executive's 2011-2012 Policy Address. Members agreed that the Panel should also discuss at the meeting the item "Proposed Guidelines on Election-related Activities in respect of the Chief Executive Election issued by the Electoral Affairs Commission" as proposed by the Administration. Members further agreed that the regular meeting should be held from 2:30 pm to 4:30 pm.

# IV. Any other business

11. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 12:45 pm.
