I. Election of Chairman and Deputy Chairman

Election of Chairman

Mr CHAN Hak-kan, Chairman in office, invited nominations for the chairmanship.

- 2. <u>Mr WONG Yung-kan</u> nominated Mr CHAN Hak-kan, and the nomination was seconded by <u>Mr CHAN Kin-por</u>. <u>Mr CHAN Hak-kan</u> accepted the nomination.
- 3. There being no other nominations, Mr CHAN Hak-kan was declared Chairman of the Panel for the 2011-2012 session.

Election of Deputy Chairman

- 4. <u>Mr CHAN Hak-kan</u> took the chair and invited nominations for the deputy chairmanship.
- 5. <u>Miss Tanya CHAN</u> nominated Ms Audrey EU, and the nomination was seconded by <u>Mr WONG Yung-kan</u>. <u>Ms Audrey EU</u> accepted the nomination.
- 6. There being no other nominations, Ms Audrey EU was declared Deputy Chairman of the Panel for the 2011-2012 session.

CB(1) 12/11-12

- 8. The <u>Chairman</u> advised that upon the request of Mr IP Wai-ming, the subject of "Alleged breakdown of taxis/minibus after filling up with liquefied petroleum gas" had been included in the list of outstanding items for discussion. Referring to the list, <u>Miss Tanya CHAN</u> requested for discussion of the subject on "Balance between development and nature conservation" within the fourth quarter of 2011.
- 9. <u>Ms Cyd HO</u> suggested inviting the Administration to brief members on the outcome of consultation on the draft guidelines on Industry Best Practices for External Lighting Installations, as well as the latest progress of the way forward in tackling nuisance caused by external lighting.
- 10. <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u> requested discussion on the feasibility of introducing legislation on mandatory separation of municipal solid waste (MSW). <u>Professor Patrick LAU</u> considered that instead of discussing the policy on mandatory separation of MSW, it would be more useful to discuss the means through which refuse was collected, including the use of separate refuse collection vehicles for different kinds of wastes.

Action - 4 -

- Noting that the Court of Appeal had handed down the judgment of Hong 11. Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge judicial review, Ms Audrey EU considered it opportune for the Administration to brief members on its latest position on the review of environmental impact assessment mechanism. In view of the many concerns on the environmental impacts of the development of a third runway at the Hong Kong International Airport following the publication of consultancy studies in relation to the Hong Kong International Airport Master Plan 2030, Ms EU suggested holding a joint meeting with the Panel on Economic Development to receive deputations' views. As the development of the third runway would also involve transport issues, Miss Tanya CHAN suggested inviting the Panel on Transport as well to enable a more comprehensive Consideration could also be given to setting up a joint discussion. subcommittee under the three Panels to study the development of the third The Chairman said that it would be best to focus the discussion on the environmental impacts of the development of the third runway. Nevertheless, he would liaise with the Chairmen of relevant Panels on how the discussion should proceed.
- 12. In concluding, the <u>Chairman</u> said that he would discuss the subjects raised by members at the upcoming meeting with the Secretary for the Environment to discuss the work plan of the Panel for the current session.

IV. Any other business

Subcommittee on Improving Air Quality

- 13. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Subcommittee on Improving Air Quality should continue its work in the current legislative session. As requested by Miss Tanya CHAN, the subject of Review of Air Quality Objectives would be followed up by the Subcommittee.
